The Ultimate Gift

It's the gift giving season! Me personally, I'm a terrible gift wrapper! I'll try my hardest and still end up with too much or too little wrapping paper, messy tape lines, and creases all over the place! You'll know a gift is from me, it's either a giant mess or in a bag! For years I even gave up on the practice of wrapping presents. I would just give the gift! No need for the extra layers!

For me, the gift itself is the important part. It's the part I put thought and energy into, trying to find the perfect fit for someone in my life. I know for others, the wrapping itself is a sign of their love and care. But for me, it's what's under the paper that I want the recipient to focus on, not necessarily the bows and boxes.

When I was a rookie youth leader, I actually saw this in action in a hysterical way. Our youth group was having a white elephant gift exchange and all the student circled around waiting for their chance to pick a gift or steal someone else's! Quickly a beautifully wrapped golden gift became the envy of everyone's eye. It has beautiful ribbon, perfectly placed wrapping paper, and a big red bow. It had to be something special we all thought! So each round the next student in line would steal the golden box. Each new student letting out a slight sigh of disappointment as they traded the golden box for dollar store socks, pez dispensers, and hot sauce...along with all the other random goodies that come out during a white elephant gift exchange. Finally, the moment we had been waiting for. The last student who pulled the final number of the lottery. It was his choice to steal any gift or take the last package left in the circle. Without hesitation he slid that last package to the current holder of the golden box and took that beautiful package for his own. As one dejected student opened a \$5 McDonald's gift card our golden box carrying young man smiled with pride ready to open his reward at the end of this long and silly game. He carefully removed the bow, untied the ribbon, slide his finger into the golden packaging to find a cigar box. He smiled again as he opened the lid to find... Manure. One cigar box full of fresh from the farm manure. The youth group erupted with laughter. The person who brought the gift finally let out the belly laugh they had been holding in for thirty minutes. All of sudden the gift card and hot sauce seemed like much better gifts! The package didn't matter, because the inside stunk! It's a reminder of how we treat people! So often focused on all the presentation, all the packaging, creating a pretty box, but inside we stink! We don't love as we ought to, we don't care the way we should.

Even Jesus was subject to this. The Jewish people weren't looking for a baby in a manger to be the Messiah. God's chosen savior was supposed to come as a mighty king, swinging a sword, and leading an army! Or so they thought. Instead, they found an amazing gift in a surprisingly humble package. Not a king. No throne. No white garment. No mighty stead or fiery sword. Just a baby lying in a manger, surrounded by the animals, held in the arms of his mother.

They didn't even know how amazing the gift they received would be. Let us all remember this year the surprising ways that God reveals Himself. It's not always how we'd expect, and it's definitely not always wrapped up in the prettiest package.

You've Been Gifted






Christmas Funds


