## Entering 6th-8th Grade

### Math

All students entering 6<sup>th</sup>-8<sup>th</sup> Grade are expected to know their basic facts upon entering the school year in August 2021. Please practice these skills together as a family. All students should know their addition, subtraction, multiplication, and division facts.

This summer, we are using the exciting educational game called Prodigy AGAIN!! They will start with a placement test; it may seem easy (do not help them, or they will be placed incorrectly), then it will level out. They need to complete 80 minutes a week or 20 minutes a day for four days a week; however, they would like to do it.
