Meeting on Thursday February 18th was held by telecommunication / zoom video call

1. **Call to Order** - Meeting was called to order at 5:30 p.m. by Chairperson Bruce Jones.

2. **Roll Call** - Erik Gorham, acting secretary for this meeting called the roll. The following delegates were present: Bruce Jones, Murray Powell, Erik Gorham, Joe Jarboe, Kristen Gemeny, Jon De Morales and Don Potts.

3. **Agency Reports and Updates** -
 - 3.1. **Sheriff's office** - There were 1560 calls for service, compared to last year 500 more calls that is about a 7% increase. A total of 300 calls out of the Templeton area. There were 205 reports in Templeton 3 assault and battery reports, a few domestic and family violence reports, 1 report taken out of those calls. 4 burglary reports in one instance there was a suspect who broke into a locked mailbox and another suspect who broke into a house. There was 1 vandalism report taken at Templeton Elementary. There were 11 calls of suspicious activity, there was a man who walked up a driveway for a ride, and two 2 wallets stolen out of purses in local grocery stores. County sheriff wanted to remind the public to stay safe and keep eyes open for suspicious activity.
 - 3.2. **California Highway Patrol** - There were 12 crashes in the Templeton area. 8 of which were property damage only. 10 DUI related collisions that were reported and investigated. 1444 contact reports and 589 speed violations, 44 of which were reported in the Templeton area. 11 seatbelt violations and 32 DUI related arrests.
 - 3.3. **Supervisory District One** - The board is currently working on a rent funding project for small businesses in SLO county, recognizing the struggles COVID-19 and its regulations have caused on the small business owners in the area. The county is also working on covid vaccine update that will be available March 15th for those over 65 , next week the county plans to administer 1000 vaccines. Paso will administer over 600 second doses with 15 percent of people in our country already vaccinated.
 - 3.4. **County Planning** - No Report.
 - 3.5. **Templeton Community Service District** - Last Tuesday there was a milestone event to recognize the reeling of new water units for templeton(with a waiting list). TCSD also approved of a new and improved master plan for the Fire Department.
