 - G. Knights of Columbus- no report, have many October activities: Euchre party, Octoberfest and Trunk-or-Treat.
 - H. Parish Council- looking at storage options with possible outbuilding, new phone system coming soon for offices and checking out options to improve sound system in church. - 2. The Mercy Day in Action on October 1st was a great success. At St. Martin's, medical equipment was collected and distributed to various places. It is being planned for next year but with a few adjustments such as modifying the locations for the opening and closing services.
- 3. Dr. Anita Werling's organ concert on October 9th was awesome. About 50 people attended and were delighted with her performance.
- 4. The ladies SPA retreat was very successful. About 50 women participated and were inspired by the presentation given by Kathleen Lindemann. All enjoyed a delicious lunch and received a bagful of items to help them be "Spiritually Prepared Always." Centerpieces with beautiful items such as jewelry, scarves, etc. were raffled.
- 5. The Rosary Rally held in front of the church on October 15th at 2 PM was one of the best attended. About 80 people gave witness by their prayer for our country including members of the K of C, the ACWC and parishioners. Pat Kaczmarski will be turning the leadership of the Rally to the K of C next year.
- 6. Our Anointing Mass on Oct. 12th filled both sides of the middle aisle. With the help of Fr. Bob Blondell and the adult choir it, was a very prayerful and moving experience.
- 7. In trying to find a place for signs in the church to remind folks that they are entering a sacred place, we found that above the doors going into the church is not a possibility. - 1. World Mission Sunday is October 23rd. Special pink envelopes for this collection are available at the church offering boxes in church.
- 2. Priesthood Sunday is October 30th. If there is a priest that has influenced you or served you and is now retired or actively serving, consider sending him a note, card or email to thank him for his ministry and let him know you are praying for him.
- 3. Ways of making families with young children feel welcome at Mass was discussed. Having a card with some helpful suggestions such as encouraging them to sit near the front, letting them know where our ushers' room is, etc. was a suggestion given.
- 4. Synod 16 takes place from November 18-20. A special prayer for this will be in our bulletin and recited as the closing prayer to the universal prayer each week until the conclusion of the Synod. 200 cards with this prayer will be sent to us from the AOD.
- 5. As directed by the AOD, a Mass count will be taken the weekends of Oct. 29-30 and Nov. 5-6.
- 6. On November 14th at 7:00PM, Fr. Nick will be participating in an "Evening of Praise and Worship" at Our Lady of Hope Church in St. Clair Shores. This will include Eucharistic Adoration and Benediction, a reflection given by Fr. Nick, some praise and worship music and some quiet time for private prayer. Members of the Worship Commission and Contemporary Group are invited and welcome to experience this unique type of musical prayer.
- 7 a. The Mass for Pardon held at the Cathedral was a truly uplifting experience. The Cathedral was packed with people and a Litany of Pardon was recited as our bishops prostrated themselves before a large crucifix. We hope to be able to print copies of that litany and also of the universal prayers. We may consider having a Mass for Pardon at St. Martin's in the future.
- b. We are urged to be mindful especially at Communion time that those receiving Holy Communion consume the Body of Christ immediately. Also we are asked to watch over and protect the large bowl with unconsecrated hosts that is placed on the Offertory table. Recently, several hosts were found in the pews (assumed to be not consecrated) on a Monday afternoon during church cleaning.
- c. Based on a recommendation from the Amazing Parish Conference, we will be evaluating the quality of our preaching, our music ministry and our welcoming ministry.
- d. It is suggested that we put something similar to our outdoor manger scene on the north porch of the church also on the south side of the church as an evangelization tool for those travelling both north and south on Hoover Road.
