Si se le hace falta ahora, aproveche este mes a conseguirlo para tenerla en mano por el 6 de septiembre. Los estudiantes que asistieron a las clases el año pasado deben reinscribirse de nuevo.

Los requisitos para matricularse incluyen los siguientes (1) que los padres y sus niños hagan el compromiso asistir regularmente a una de las Misas del fin de semana acá en Santa María a través del año (2) que la familia se comprometa a practicar la corresponsabilidad (de su tiempo, talento y tesoro) a su parroquia de Santa María. (3) que la familia sea registrada en nuestra parroquia de Santa María. Si no está inscrito, tome ahora un formulario de inscripción del fondo de la iglesia, llenarlo completamente y ponerlo en el cesto durante la colecta en la misa o póngalo en el buzón de la oficina parroquial.



The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops

(USCCB) announced this week the establishment of a Committee Against Racism. Initiated by Cardinal Daniel N. DiNardo, President of the USCCB, the committee will focus on addressing the sin of racism in our society, and even in our Church, and the urgent need to come together as a society to find solutions. "Recent events have exposed the extent to which the sin of racism continues to afflict our nation. The establishment of this new ad hoc committee will be wholly dedicated to engaging the Church and our society to work together in unity to challenge the sin of racism, to listen to persons who are suffering under this sin, and to come together in the love of Christ to know one another as brothers and sisters," says Cardinal DiNardo.



Bishop George V. Murry, SJ of Youngstown, Ohio has been appointed by Cardinal DiNardo as Chairman of the committee.

"I look forward to working with my brother bishops as well as communities across the United States to listen to the needs of individuals who have suffered under the sin of racism and together find solutions to this epidemic of hate that has plagued our nation for far too long," says Bishop Murry.

Religious Education Classes Soon to Begin



Parents and students are notified that our classes begin at 6 PM on Wednesday the 6th of September. After Masses this weekend and the two following pre-registration is taking

place in the parish hall.

Parents are reminded that both "Mass and Class" go hand in hand with religious formation. This is also the time for parents to recall that Vatican Council II teaches parents form a "domestic church". Consequently, at this time of the year, parents are to re-commit to attending weekly one of our parish's weekend Masses with their children and to do so throughout the year. By so doing parents show "Religious values are more caught than taught."

There is no registration fee but students will need to purchase their books and are expected to study from them as part of their "domestic church" homework. Wednesday evening Faith Formation classes begin with sign-ins at 6:00, assembly at 6:15, and finish at 7:30. On class nights our teachers will available at 6 PM and remain until 7:40 PM. For this 2017-18 year there will be about three dozen sessions.


Weekly Figure Happily Rectified Downward



As reported to the members of parish's Finance Council in their meeting recent monthly meeting, a miscalculation that overstated the weekly offertory figure in our parish budget has been discovered and promptly rectified. This results in good news because the required amount needed now weekly for the offertory collection has decreased. Thus, as indicated in the box below, the figure decreases from the previous figure of \$3,026 to \$2,925 from now on until the end of this Fiscal Year (June 2018). "Felix culpa!"
