Have you ever heard that old saying, "If you want to make God laugh...tell Him your plans"? We tend to chuckle when we hear thatwe shake our heads and move on. But there is a lot of truth to that statement.

We tend to think that we have plans. We fill our electronic calendars with tons of "to do" entrees. We practically wear the "tasks" app out on our smart phone. We make lists, charts, graphs and spreadsheets- all designed to keep us as laser-focused on our plans as possible.

Don't get me wrong- planning is not a bad thing. "If you fail to plan then you plan to fail" and all that. We often need something to keep us on the right track. But where we go wrong is when we begin to act as if our plans are etched in stone and always what's best for us-because when we do that, we begin to act as if we no longer need God...or that we ARE God!

I have been made PAINFULLY aware of this reality in recent months. As I write this, I am 3 days away from surgery. By the time you read this, you will already KNOW how my surgery went. But I put these words to paper...er, computer...having no clue what the outcome will be. And that uncertainty is tough for me, because I am a planner. I like to think that I am in control and the one keeping the train running on time. But occasionally, God reminds me that those thoughts are merely illusion. Not only am I NOT in control...there IS no real control. Things happen all the time that we have NO control over. They happen whether we want them to or not.

The control that we DO have is in our response. I can't control what this tumor is doing to my body...sadly. But I CAN control how I respond to my situation. I can choose to feel sorry for myself. I can choose to be angry and resentful. I can choose to blame God for everything. OR...I can choose to remain faithful regardless of the circumstance. I can choose to make sure my glass is half-full. I can choose to remain faithful to the fact that God is good, all the time...regardless of the circumstance. Now, if you'll excuse me, I have something I've planned to do right now!!



ALEDO UNITED METHODIST CHURCH KITCHEN NEWS!

Have you worked in the church kitchen recently? If not, you should reacquaint yourself with the location of items. You will see a number of positive changes.

The United Methodist Men have purchased a used convection oven and have worked hard to prepare it for use with new shelves. This will ease our baking issues and speed up the process when multiple items are needed.

The MAP Kitchen committee has cleaned up the kitchen and relocated utensils, small appliances, dishes etc for a better workflow. All cabinets are marked with the contents.

All drinks are now being prepared in the back kitchen work area. The china plates which are infrequently used are stored in the back basement storage area in a newly purchased used plate rack. This allows more storage for food products in the cabinets.

New skillets, cutting boards, knives, safety knife holders, measuring cups and spoons, glass mixing bowls, a step stool have been purchased using money which was donated from the Follow the Star Holiday Bazaar profits for kitchen renovation. Curtains have been added to the kitchen and the basement bathrooms.

The United Methodist Women will be purchasing a professional 7 quart Kitchen Aid Mixer which will be available for use when a larger heavy duty mixer is needed. This will eliminate individuals from transporting their heavy personal mixers to the church.

Refrigerator and freezer space is still at a premium. Leftovers should be taken care of after an event by the owner of the items so that food does not accumulate and go to waste. Every item should be covered, labeled and dated when placed in the refrigerator or freezer. Anything that is not labeled for a specific purpose is common goods and can be and should used for any occasion.

We are blessed to have a very nice kitchen which is almost constantly being used to serve others. Thank you for keeping it cleaned and ready for the next event! Praise God!


So I challenge you...If you're feeling a little depressed, anxious, or scared, go out and love in/through His Name. There is always someone who could use your smile, kind words, or hugs.
