

DESIGN IN DETAIL

PROBLEM Outdated ensuite has awkward layout with a tight toilet/shower room, open vanity area and inefficient walk in closet.

SOLUTION By reconfiguring the space and stealing some space from the master bedroom, we got everything on the client's wish list into the ensuite bathroom, walk-in closet and master bedroom.

01 Freestanding tub was placed on the angle to create an easy flow in this L-shaped bathroom and visually has less weight than a tub sunken into a tile deck.

02 The new layout allowed for his and her vanities. Of course, hers is longer!

03 Vanity design features open shelves, furniture style base and translucent acrylic panels.

04 The accent tile was the inspiration for the colour scheme, and was used as a backsplash and accent tile in shower.

05 Wall lights provide the bright light needed for shaving and makeup application, while the potlights in the ceiling light the balance of the space.

06 The wood trim not only finishes the tile but creates a display shelf and caps the top of the 1/2 wall.

07 Travertine tile was used on the floor and for the shower walls.

08 A coat tree is used as a towel bar, as we had no convenient wall space for a towel bar.

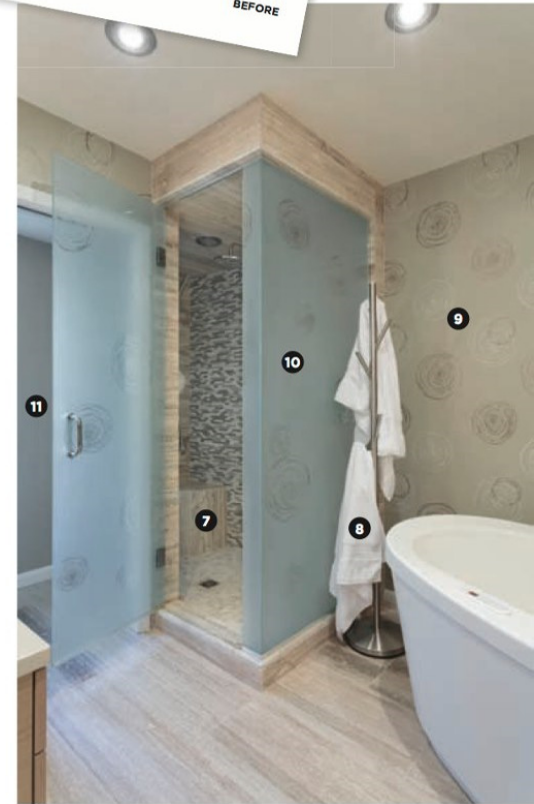
09 The circular motive was painted on the walls and then repeated on the etched glass design.

10 The shower doors were sandblasted to hide the water spots.

11 Toilet remained in the same location to save on plumbing changes.
