ABOUT US

The Economic Mobility Program makes grants across three portfolios – Essential Human Services, Pathways for Success, and Bachelor's Completion – toward a vision of expanded opportunity for low-income Silicon Valley residents. Sobrato Philanthropies also invests directly in the region's nonprofit ecosystem by providing in-kind office and meeting space through its four Sobrato Centers for Nonprofits. Beyond these programs, Sobrato Philanthropies has expanded to new strategies including impacting systemic change on behalf of English Learners in the state and investing in ocean conservation and plastic reduction efforts globally.

ABOUT THE POSITION

The Senior Program Officer will play a significant role as a member of the Sobrato Philanthropies team, reporting to the Program Director, Economic Mobility and working collaboratively with a team of colleagues to lead and help shape key elements of strategy design, implementation, evaluation and learning in the Economic Mobility Program. The senior program officer will develop, implement, and adapt strategy to address structural barriers and support increased economic mobility for low-income Silicon Valley residents. In particular, they will lead local grantmaking with a focus on a range of strategies impacting economic mobility, including career pathways, small business and entrepreneurship, and postsecondary success for first generation and low-income students. The senior program officer will demonstrate deep knowledge about promising strategies and approaches to support economic mobility, with an emphasis on catalyzing change for low-income Silicon Valley individuals and families. They will have an understanding of the local, state, and national landscape and systems related to economic inclusion and barriers to economic mobility faced by low-income populations and communities of color. They will apply strategic thinking and meaningful knowledge and understanding across a variety of issue areas to drive impact in Silicon Valley, but need not be an expert on every issue.

The senior program officer will bring and cultivate deep relationships with local stakeholders, develop feedback loops that leverage community voice as a key input into strategy, and deploy evaluation toward outcomes and learning. They will be grounded in humility and respect for the audiences and stakeholders we serve and will be curious, collaborative, and growth-minded with the capacity and desire to leverage all of Sobrato Philanthropies' tools – grant dollars, capacity building, evaluation, investments, leadership, and real estate – toward community impact. The senior program officer will also artfully synthesize concepts and data into effective communications for a range of audiences. We will honor and recognize the multitude of valuable experiences pertaining to this role, including lived, educational, and career experience as valuable.

KEY RESPONSIBILITIES

Program Strategy and Planning

- Design, implement, and adapt a strategy to increase economic mobility for low-income Silicon Valley residents
- Stay abreast of current research, policy, activities, and trends related to economic mobility
- Provide regular updates and briefings to leadership in coordination with the Director
- Develop annual goals, corresponding activities, indicators of success, and a budget as part of the foundation's annual planning and budgeting cycle; provide ongoing timely and accurate forecasting
- Build collaborative and positive working relationships and effective communication channels with all staff, seeking input from others and offering support in return
- Participate in team meetings to coordinate work, report on progress, flag challenges and offer insights
- Document and track learning from the Economic Mobility portfolio to inform program shifts and communicate lessons learned with stakeholders
- Partner with grants management team to ensure solid grantmaking processes are in place and followed
- Special projects and duties as assigned

Grantmaking

- Identify potential grantees and projects, coordinate and conduct due diligence on organizations, investigate and assess grant proposals, and present recommended proposals for funding
- Build and maintain trust-based relationships with grantees, current and prospective, including conducting site visits and providing technical assistance
- Work cross-functionally with colleagues to identify and implement capacity building and monitoring, evaluation and learning (ME&L) priorities for the portfolio, and promote learning across the portfolio and organization
- Engage in and manage monitoring, evaluation and learning in relation to the portfolio's outcomes, learning priorities, and strategic goals
- As appropriate, contribute to responsive grantmaking including family-initiated or special opportunities

Relationship and Network Building

- Cultivate and manage relationships with nonprofits, philanthropic partners, consulting partners, and other key stakeholders in the Silicon Valley economic mobility landscape to keep abreast of local trends, leverage peer learning and drive program outcomes
- Build networks with key government, philanthropic, and nonprofit leaders to coordinate efforts and funding
- Represent Sobrato Philanthropies to various constituencies including in outside conferences and meetings
