TRANSPORTATION



Freight are still above average and trucks are limited. Mexico is still experiencing a fuel shortage. This could affect imports in the coming weeks.

WEATHER



Southeast: Mostly warm weather with cool nights, high chance of rain

Salinas: Cool days with cold nights, cloudy/rain throughout the week

Coachella: Very hot days and cooler nights, partly cloudy most of the week

CROP REPORT



Apples – Market remains steady on good volume, organic prices are rising by the week



Avocado - Market is overloaded and are starting to fall. Two-tier market at the border is the issue. Current inventory is high but is expected to fall in line very quickly



Banana – Market is steady with good volume and quality



Blackberries – In good production for the next two weeks



Blueberries – Supply will be low until more growing regions begin

CROP REPORT



Grapes – Active market on greens. Red grapes are steady but are expected to become active



Lemons – Market is becoming very active on smaller sizes due to lighter supplies. Quality is very good



Limes – Supplies are tight due to lower volume from Mexico due to weather



Mangoes – Good availability on imported mangoes



Melons Cantaloupe – Supplies are declining and retail has created a demand exceeds supply situation. Limited supplies for the next month

CROP REPORT



Melon Honeydew – Good volume for the larger fruit. Sizing has been very large with mostly jumbos. Small fruit will continue to be low



Oranges – Market is steady. Valencias have started. Quality is good to very good



Pears – Anjou, Bosc, and reds available with good supply through June. Pears are a great value at this time



Pineapple – Volume has slowed as yields are coming off a strong Q1. Most of the incoming volume is taken with Easter loading happening soon. Availability will be back after Easter

Raspberries – Market has improved with more volume available



Strawberries – Good supply and quality now. Volume will remain strong



Watermelon – Good volume from Mexico and Florida. FL quality is excellent and peak volume will be over the next few weeks

Asparagus – Market is active as transitions continue. Quality is good to very good



Broccoli – Market is moving upwards due to increasing yields. Quality is better



Cauliflower – Market is moving towards demand exceeds supply. Quality is fair to good



Carrots – Steady quality from CA Central Valley



Corn – The market remains steady



Celery – Quality has improved with better color and sizing. Supply remains low due to the unsuccessful season

Cucumber – Market is active with good movement. Supplies are good



Eggplant – Short supply but good quality with more volume expected to come. Demand is good



Garlic – Supply is steady as we finish CA's storage crop



Ginger - Chinese markets are mixed, but quality is good. Product is available at higher costs from Brazil, Peru, and Thailand



Green Cabbage – Supply has improved and is good

Green Onion – Quality, supply, and demand are good



Kale – Supplies remain steady with good quality



Lettuce Iceberg - We will be in Salinas from the rest of the season. Supplies are plentiful with strong quality



Leaf Green and Red- Green supply and quality are good while red supply is tight

Leaf Romaine – Supply is greater than expected. Quality is good with weights around 34-36 lbs

CROP REPORT

Leaf Romaine Hearts – Supply this week is normal and will continue like this for the next month



Onions – Red market is high with good quality. Yellow market is steady with good quality. White market is high with fair quality



Pepper, Bell – Market will come up as Mexico wraps up



Potato – Market is stable with good availability. Pricing has leveled off. No transportation issues during this time



Spinach – Quality and supply are good



Squash – Zucchini supply, demand, and quality are good. Yellow squash supplies are short with a strong market

Tomato - Round: Florida's supply is stronger this week. Sizing is larger. Quality is good



Romas: Availability is steady but light

Grapes: Back down to normal level. Plenty of good quality fruit

Cherries: Cherries are steady to up. Supply is light. Quality is fair to good
