# **OPEN ENTRIES ONLY** – NO Youth Entries **YOUTH MUST enter in Department 11**

**RULES:** (In addition to the General Rules)

- 1. The use or displaying of artificial flowers is prohibited and no premiums will be paid.
- 2. Plants positively will not be accepted for exhibition unless they have been growing in containers for two months.
- 3. The management will not undertake to return exhibits or be responsible for the return or exhibits. Baskets and containers must be supplied by the exhibitor and will be given every possible care, but the management assumes no responsibility for their safety.
- 4. Flowers or plants entered for competition must be more than ordinary standard and quality to be entered for an award.
- 5. All entries must be grown by the exhibitor except in an arrangement class.
- 6. One entry per class per exhibitor.
- 7. Label plant or flower with name of species.
- 8. One plant to a pot.

One BEST OF SHOW - Commemorative Ribbon maybe given in this department.

#### SECTION E- ARTISTIC ARRANGEMENTS

- No artificial flowers or foliage permitted.

#### **CLASS**

- 1. Arrangement of Wild Flowers less than 12". No plants forbidden by conservation should be used.
- 2. Arrangement of Wild Flowers over 12".
- 3. Arrangement using dried materials, wreaths and live arrangements.
- 4. Arrangement on pedestal container.
- 5. Fruit and/or vegetable arrangement with or without foliage or flower.
- 6. Arrangement featuring a candle.
- 7. Arrangement in a bottle.
- 8. Arrangement using one flower only, foliage and/or accessories permitted.
- 9. Arrangement depicting a holiday or special occasion.
- 10. All white arrangement, foliage permitted

## SECTION F - FLORAL ARRANGEMENT COMPETITION - THEME: AGRICULTURE

Each entry will be judged for use of color, form, neatness, and how unique the arrangement is, and of course how well you incorporated the theme into your arrangement. For example, you could use vegetables or hay or a little tractor. We are encouraging everyone to enter whether you are a professional floral arranger or a non-professional.

All entries will be separated into categories based on color, size (small, medium, large) and Professional, non-Professional and fresh vs. artificial. An example of a Professional would be an exhibitor from a Flower Shop or Garden Club. Therefore, please specify how your entry was made.
