Whenever you enter a house, first say, 'May peace be on this house! 'Luke 10:5 Watchword February

Dear members and friends of Immanuel Lutheran Church:

It is interesting to hear and read this watchword for

the month February. When reading this in context we learn that Jesus appointed 72 and sent them two by two ahead of him to every town and place where he was about to go. This direction was important, when entering a house of a stranger. "I come in peace and will no harm", comes to mind.

Not many of us might enter anymore a house of a stranger in mission anymore. Strangers we do meet in worship, for example.

A warm **greeting** and starting a brief conversation will lower the anxiety and open the door into the community. It made a huge difference and we felt cared for that someone offered to sit with my husband and me during worship, when we moved to NE Ohio over 7 years ago. This helped us to become a part of that particular worshipping community in NE Ohio.

Greetings of peace are part of our liturgy and we use them many times:

Greetings have their place in the gathering rite at the beginning of worship. The presiding minister greets the whole assembly with the words of Paul (2 Cor. 13:13) to greet the churches more than over 1950 years ago¹. Then the assembly greets the presiding minister in return. Therefore we are in dialogue with each other. Another greeting is: "the Lord be with you" and the reply of the assembly "And also with you". This is located at the beginning of the" liturgy of the meal". This is an ancient dialogue. "Both greetings are placed at two major tasks the presiding minister is appointed to do. These two greetings signal love, trust, mutual service and the hope in God, who makes such service possible²."

"Grace and peace to you from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ" is another greeting before the sermon.

Then we have the "Peace". It closes the word-section of the service as we transition to the "Meal" – it acts like a seam³. The peace functions like a seal on our prayers (of intercession for example). It shows that we are sincere in our prayers. As Christ stood among his disciples on Sunday, stating "Peace be with you" (John 20:19, 26), so we speak this

gift to the presiding minister and then to each other including the visitor in our midst⁴. In other words we pray for and have received the reconciliation of Jesus Christ.

Now we are moving into the liturgy of the meal. Again presiding minister greets and more so in dialogue with the congregation. "The Lord be with you. – And also with you. Lift up your hearts. – We lift them to the Lord. …." These words may remind us about the greeting of the angel Gabriel to Mary in the Gospel of Luke⁵. "The assembly and the presiding minister are invited to know of the presence of Christ whom we have encountered in the word"⁵. So much for a little look into our liturgy and the importance of greetings in Lutheran Worship. Its more than just words, we connect with God and we build community.
