



## C.O.M.B. Meeting

Dale Woods and Kay Barber went over multiple strategies and methods for harvesting honey. Dale went over extracting and determining when frames of honey were ready. Kay went over the crush and drain method of extracting honey. Kay reminded club members that the club has an extractor to rent. Members were encouraged to give the hand crank extractor a try. Mike Risk had his refractometer and club members were encouraged to either submit a sample of their honey or just look at honey samples with the refractometer. Mike discussed as well did Dale about having the moisture content of honey low enough so it did not ferment. There was sampling of honey from Dale's frames being extracted and Jennifer Blackburn brought some blackberry honey for sampling. Meeting adjourned approximately 8:05pm with several reminders.
