October Reflection

Jeremiah 32:6-7 "Jeremiah said, The word of the Lord came to me: Hanamel son of your uncle Shallum is going to come to you and say, 'Buy my field that is at Anathoth for the right of redemption by purchase is yours.'"

Y'all I have to tell you I am excited for fall. I love the beginnings of fall, the leaves changing, the crisp weather, apple cider, and even occasionally having to put on a light jacket. It is a wonderful season, but I will say I never really allow myself to enjoy it not as much as I should at least. Because I know as soon as the air starts to get a little nippy, winter is on its way.

Winter I must admit is my least favorite season. It is a slow season of life. Don't get me wrong we get it started off with a bang, we are awfully busy with advent, but after the trees and the bright lights of Christmas have come down it seems often we are left in a bit of a lull. I do not like the lull, kids can't run outside so, so they run inside driving the parents crazy, it gets dark at 5, it's just not ideal. It is a slow season, and I know I will find myself longing for the hot and busy days of summer.

Well in Scripture, these down times often set the stage for God sized visions. That is what is happening in this Jeremiah passage. It is a down time in the life of Israel, the Babylonian invasion is about to begin, both the Northern and Southern Kingdoms of Israel are crumbling. Jeremiah has preached that this was going to happen, but no one would listen to him.

So it is in the sinking depression that grips the nation that God calls on Jeremiah to do something strange. God calls on Jeremiah to buy up some real estate. Now I do not know how the impeding invasion of a hostile nation affects real estate prices, but I imagine no one is buying at that time. Not only does Jeremiah buy the field, but he pays well above what that field would have gone for. In the middle of a war zone, God calls on Jeremiah to buy a field, as a sign that God is going to deliver Israel. The purchase of this field would have seemed ludicrous to everyone around Jeremiah, but he knew it was a vision God had given him, and he was confident in the promise of God.

Now God hasn't stopped giving vision and guidance to his people over the past three thousand years, but there are times when we get too busy, too wrapped up in other things to really take stock of where it is that God is leading us. First United Methodist Church in Andrews North Carolina found themselves in quite a dilemma a few years ago.

If you don't know about Andrews it is a very small mountain community. It is the kind of place that you don't go to on accident. There are no major business in or around Andrews, and each year the population shrinks a little bit. The church like the town around it was shrinking, they were growing older and smaller each year. So they decided they needed to take some time to vision, to figure out where it was that God was leading them.


During their visioning process one of the older members of the church said, "Each day there is a group of young boys who play basketball at the park across from my house, but when it rains there is no where for

them to go. What if we built an indoor gymnasium?" The idea seemed ludicrous to just about everyone at the meeting. Why would a church with an average age of 78 build a brand spanking new gym?

Well they prayed about it, and prayed about it, and the strangest thing happened, the more they prayed the more they felt led to build a family life center. To the town it seemed absurd, that a church would spend the kind of money they were on something that it didn't really seem would benefit the church one bit. But after ten years would you believe it? that church has radically changed. The church now has over twenty families, their worshiping attendance has grown, their impact in their community has grown, and where most churches in our conference have grown older, Andrews UMC has actually grown younger with an average age of 50 now.

It took a God sized vision and a willingness to step out in faith, but if God gives us the vision we know God is going to see it through. As we approach what will be somewhat of a calmer season in the life of our church, I want you to do something for me. I want you to pray for where God is leading us. Pray that God will give us a vision for how we can grow in our relationship to God and in our relationship to our neighbors. For I will say it again, God still gives the vision just like he did to Jeremiah. The question is are we going to be willing to embrace it? With your prayers and with the grace of God I know we will. Have a blessed month.
