

## **Religious Education Connection**

## <u>The Spokesperson for God in the Old Testament—Moses, part 1</u>

For the next few weeks, the weekday readings will relate the events, which bring the future People of God to the centerpiece of the entire Old Testament—the consecration of the Covenant between God and God's people. A rather reluctant prophet, Moses, is set to the task of speaking for God, leading the people to pass over from slavery to freedom, and learning how to handle all this freedom, gifted by God, by means of a journey to the Promised Land that would, eventually, take a generation.

In the Sinai Desert, Moses climbed Mount Sinai and had a face-to-face meeting with God. When he came down from the mountain, he brought with him the Ten Commandments, written by the finger of God. However, he discovered that the people had lost themselves to serious sin. Moses raged at the people and shattered the Commandments upon the ground rather than let the people falsely enter into the Covenant and commit an even greater sin. However, when he later spoke to God about it, Moses begged for forgiveness for the people, even to the point at which he asked God that, if God blotted out the people, then he should be blotted out, too. (Exodus 32:32) God did not blot out Moses nor the people, but there were trials along the way that would make Moses question over and over as to why God had chosen him to lead this "stiff-necked" people.

Moses conveyed more than the Ten Commandments. Included in *The Law* were many ritual regulations, and there were general instructions, too. These Chosen People were to love God as well as be in awe of God, to love their neighbors as themselves, and to love the stranger—the non-Jews, who had also escaped Egypt and were now living among them—as well as themselves.
