# Phase V Board of Directors Meeting April 12, 2017

The Meeting was called to order at 1:10P.M. By the President. All board members were in attendance. We had 22 residents in the audience. The Pledge of allegiance was given and meeting began.

March meeting minutes were approved as written without correction or comment.

Jim Reushlein gave the Financial report for the first quarter and as the budget was approved we are currently \$29,751.00 under budget.

Per Jim, we have currently tarped the roofs for protection the adjuster has come and we are currently waiting for instructions and a dollar figure we can work with. Roofs that had to have immediate attention (ie Shingles added) Jim had the roofer add them in an entirely different color or texture so the Adjuster would know this was also damage and not the original roof. (smart Jim). Damage was done to 9 buildings and trees also.

The first round up of Goose eggs got 20 eggs from the nests. The second round up will be on the 27<sup>th</sup> of April per the DNR instructions. Let Jim know if you would like to help.

With this being our second season of this collection we should hopefully see a significant reduction of our feathered friends in the ponds and roadways.

The water bill report for 2016 has been received and we spent \$157,799.56 for the year.

The billing for 5/24-9/12 was the highest for us at \$44,790.18. If you are interested you can check out how your building did in the consumption it will be on the Community Bulletin Board.

Our Current Delinquent accounts are at \$5,303.34. Mostly just 1 month in arrears or late charges.

All street signs have been replaced with the new ones. (Thank you Paul) The extra billing from Paul was a total of \$271.70. Well worth the struggle to get the old ones off and the new ones attached.

We currently have 3 units for sale. Two on Lexington Dr. and one on Raleigh Ct.

Listed at \$89,00.00, \$90,00.00 and \$92,500.00 respectively.

We have received our pool license for 2017. as mentioned in last month's newsletter we have 2 new Pool attendants. Debbie and Katie, Best of luck ladies in your new endeavor.

Discussion on the viability of SHOCKING Versus Draining cleaning and refilling of fresh water. Jim Said it would only be maybe \$200.00 to \$300.00 and to prevent possible allergic reactions etc. better safe than sorry. However, the health department will determine best way to handle and open pool.

July Keeling would like some green thumb ladies to take over the planting beds outside the club house. This was also one of Sue Lathams love and now that she is in Florida we could use help so as not to lose a good thing. Call Judy at 734-972-0066.

Judy and Cindy attended the March All Phase Board I-IV meeting and were welcomed with open arms. I-IV have agreed not to replace the additional speed bumps and would also like to add a walking path on the street with a yellow line near curbside, Heritage Drive.

This will narrow the car paths and we should all be AWARE of the 15 MPH limit. Cars who do not respect this limit and drive carelessly close to our residents walking their pooches or just out for a stroll will be hunted down and fined if necessary. Remember we are mostly a retirement population and no one should have such issues as to disrespect the community because they are more IMPORTANT than obeying our laws.

Phase V was asked to continue the walk way. However, I-IV want to put it on the opposite side of where our street lights are so the board has declined to join in.

Peggy Booker and Debbie Staebler brought up the night time meetings and Jim said it was a misunderstanding he would not charge an additional fee to attend however he did not want it on a weekend.

### Easy Fruity Pork Chop Casserole

1 can apple pie filling

1 package or box of Pork stuffing mix

Line bottom of 9 X13 with pie mixture, place pork chops on top. Mix stuffing according to package directions and place on top of pork chops.

Bake at 350 covered for 35 - 45 minutes. Uncover and continue baking about 1 hour longer.

## It's Time To 'Spring Clean' Your Medicine Cabinet

Don't forget to organize your medicine cabinet while you're spring cleaning! Keep a stock of these common over-the-counter (OTC) medicines handy so you don't have to dash off to the pharmacy when you're not feeling well. Here are 10 "Medicine Cabinet Essentials." Always check with a doctor/pharmacist before taking a new medication to be sure it's right for you.

1. Acetaminophen (Tylenol®): The most commonly recommended OTC medication for fever. It also works well for minor aches and pains. Acetaminophen does not carry the same bleeding risks as the non-steroidal anti-inflammatory drugs (NSAIDs).
2. Dextromethorphan (Delsym®): A fast-acting cough suppressant that works for 12 hours. Great for a dry, hacking cough.
3. Loratadine (Claritin®): A non-drowsy antihistamine that is used to treat the symptoms of sneezing, runny nose, and watery eyes.
4. Simethicone (Gas-X®): This OTC medication is used to reduce/relieve gas and the feeling of stomach bloating. It works by breaking up large gas bubbles into smaller bubbles that are easier to pass.

5. Diphenhydramine (Benadryl®): This antihistamine is the gold-standard for treating allergic reactions including itching and hives because it works quickly. Be mindful that this medication causes sedation.
6. Docosanol (Abreva®): If you suffer from cold sores Abreva® is a must-buy. It shortens the outbreak by protecting healthy cells from the herpes virus.
7. Vaseline®: Use this the next time you have a minor cut or burn. The petroleum jelly will seal in moisture so the skin heals faster.
8. Chloraseptic® lozenges: These 'cough drops' are medicated with benzocaine that will numb a sore throat.
9. Vicks® VapoRub: A topical cough medicine with medicated vapors that can also help with nasal congestion.
10. Aquaphor® Healing Ointment: Great for dry lips, hands, heels, elbows, etc.

# Garage Sales, Here and There

Everyone likes a good garage or estate sale, right? That's judged by the crowds that show up for Colonial Acres events, which will now be part of the city-wide **South Lyon Garage Sale** May 2.

Well, this month's effort to get you out of the house and your recliner highlights just those same events, as well as a few spots you or your family can find some great antiques, and see more of the state.

Let's start with the **M-15 Garage Sale**, a 60-mile junk and treasure extravaganza coming up May 6. It's also a way to discover one of Michigan's earmarked Heritage Routes. M-15 perhaps was one route you and/or your parents may have taken Up North. This sale stretches over five counties. M-15, if you're unfamiliar, runs from about Pontiac to Bay City and was a way to sneak around the traffic on then-two-lane U.S. 23 when one went north. It trickles through tiny towns on the edge of the Thumb before dumping into Bay City, where you can once again team up with U.S. 23.

It's not only a relaxing ride through some quaint countryside, but you may pick up a trunk-full of bargains, too.

And, let's step back a bit for **South Lyon's** own event, May 2. This year it also coincides with the **Colonial Acres combined sale**. It's time to clean out your basement, and let someone else have fun with treasures you no longer treasure. It's also the only day when you do not need a city permit to hold a sale. See the newsletter elsewhere for more information.

The other granddaddy of garage sales won't happen until August. It's **Michigan's Longest Garage Sale**, along the U.S. 12 Heritage Route. U.S. 12, if you're unfamiliar, begins in Detroit and ends at the Pacific Ocean, a great multi-week trek if you're interested. This garage sale is Aug. 11-13 and it runs from border to border in our

state, starting in Detroit. For information, go to [www.us12heritagetrail.org](http://www.us12heritagetrail.org). It has the route, places to stop overnight from beautiful B&Bs to beautiful campgrounds, and more info on the heritage route itself, which I like to think I had a hand in creating. Michigan heritage routes began to be recognized after I wrote a story on the route and others in AAA Michigan Living on my own highway tours. The highway was once the stagecoach route between Detroit and Chicago. There were tales of farmers who would create mud bogs on the road and then charge travelers money to help get out of them.

If you go, make a stop in the tiny town of Allen a must. There are a couple of antiques shops here filled with someone's trash and treasure.

If you're really ambitious and have decided to chance leaving the confines of Colonial Acres and explore a bit, take in the **World's Longest Garage Sale**, along U.S. 127, which includes the part in Michigan from Addison, Michigan, a bit west of us, to Gadsden, Alabama. It takes place Aug. 3-6, so you've got time to do this one before turning onto U.S. 12, which crosses U.S. 127 in or near the Irish Hills, another wonderful place to explore.

Here's another: Explore antiques in the Thumb from Sebewaing, along Saginaw Bay just east of Bay City, to Algonac, along the St. Clair River, Aug. 11-13. Called the **Antique Yard Sale Trail**, it will also take you on a beautiful drive along the part of Lake Huron that many love to ignore, and shouldn't. Great restaurants in towns like Port Austin, history in Grindstone City, once one of the world's largest producers of grindstones for milling and sharpening, and walleye fishing on the St. Clair River and Saginaw Bay, are waiting for you.

I dare you.

# Mustard, Garlic and Greens

Four years ago, I walked the woods at Colonial Acres, searching for a tall, leafy green plant with a tiny, white four-petal flower on top, the telltale sign of garlic mustard, an invasive species with the potential to choke out the trillium, May apple and other native plants.

Since that time, I have found garlic mustard along the stream near the clubhouse, and in the trees bordering the railroad tracks parallel to Lexington Drive. Each year I've recruited helpers, and I'm again asking for people to help me pull out this invasive plant, which typically blooms in early May.

Garlic mustard also grows in huge areas in the woods southeast of the clubhouse pond; new this year I am asking Phase I-IV residents to help me clear their woods of this plant.

Garlic mustard should be pulled out when it flowers (that's how it can be identified), but before the flowers turn to seed. Once you know how to identify it, it is easy to spot. It's also easy to pull out; a good tug usually does it. After pulling it out, the plants need to be placed in a garbage bag and thrown out in the trash, never into any compost as that only enables the plants to grow elsewhere. The green leaves are edible, and add a little zing to a salad.

If I could get just one person to monitor the area along the creek by the clubhouse, and another to take care of the area parallel to the railroad track along Lexington would be a tremendous help. I will provide training the first week or so in May (it takes about two minutes to learn how to identify the plant.) Please consider this important stewardship activity to protect our wooded areas!

If you are interested in protecting our woods from this invasive plant, and becoming a steward to our natural areas, please give me a call. You need to be able to walk and bend over to pull out the plant, and carry a garbage bag for your findings. I can be contacted at 734-658-8755 or [dsemion@gmail.com](mailto:dsemion@gmail.com). 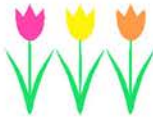
