

Dear Punta Gorda Isles Section 22 Homeowner,

As of this morning, Friday, all of our Amenities are closed, including the Marina, Freedom Boat Club, BSGAC Activity and Golf and the Fitness & Racquet Club. The Trading Post will remain open through Friday and Cass Cay Restaurant will remain open as long as weather permits.

Our gates will be manned until mid-afternoon Saturday at which time the gate barriers will be permanently open until the storm has passed. All gates to all interior communities should remain open during the storm. Our gatehouse will be manned after the storm.

Any and all items that are in your yard, or in your lanai, should be brought inside your hurricane shutter zone. Remember that if the winds tear your lanai anything on it can become a potential missile and damage other houses. All garbage cans should be brought inside. Assume that there will be no garbage pickup on Saturday.

Your Community has created an emergency command structure and a team will be doing assessments after the storm has passed. The command structure will be run temporarily at the main front gate after the storm.

However, should you have an emergency, please contact 911 and make sure you state you are in “Lee County”.

Also, we are in Zone A for Lee County. As of this morning, they are showing potential water surges of 3 to 5 feet maybe in our area depending upon where the storm comes in.

Alliant has completed all Hurricane Preparations which will protect the administrative and financial records of the community. All Essential Alliant personnel will be released as of 11:00 AM this morning to properly prepare for the coming storm. We will be in communication with your Board through out the event. We will attempt to resume normal business operations as soon as possible after the storm has passed. We will provide email updates as soon as communications in the area are restored.
