PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE BY DIANE M. GREENWELL

Our next meeting will be held Thursday, February 6th, at 7:00pm at the HB Coast Guard Auxiliary, doors open at 6:45pm.

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The purpose of this organization is to unite the property owners of Hernando Beach for Civic purposes that lead to improved quality of life.

The new 2020 Board officially took office on January 9, 2020 with a full agenda to kick off the year. More than 70 members attended the January meeting. The Hernando County Administrator, Jeff Rogers was the featured speaker. Commissioner Jeff Holcomb, conducted the ceremony for the new Board members. Thank all of you who came out to our first meeting of the year. We invite all North, Central, and South Hernando Beach property owners and business property owners to join the HBPOA to learn about important updates on issues affecting our community.

I'd like to give special recognition to our commercial realtors who purchased memberships for their new home buyers in January. Weaver Realty bought 12 memberships for her home buyers, and Tracie Maler with Keller Williams Realty also bought 12 new memberships for her new home buyers. All totaled, we had approximately 30 new memberships at our January 9<sup>th</sup> meeting. We encourage all realtors and business owners to join efforts to encourage our new property owners in the area to attend HBPOA meetings and become members.

At our January meeting a Bylaws Committee was formed to review and update our bylaws. Volunteers include, Fran Baird, Mike Fulford, Charles Greenwell, Barry Holland, Yann Milcendeau, Kelly Reeve, and John Paul Reeve. Their first kickoff meeting was held January 17, 2020 at the Silver Dolphin where they drafted suggested changes for consideration by the Board and the Membership. We thank them for taking time to volunteer to get our governing documents in order. The last update to our Bylaws was in May 2016. Currently some of the commercial property parcels qualify to join HBPOA while other parcels are not eligible under the current bylaws. We expect to include omitted commercial property own-

A round table meeting will be scheduled and announced to allow Members to add ideas, suggestions and changes that may improve our commercial area to make it have more charm and character while adding appeal and residential recreational opportunities. Leadership opportunities exist at every level. Everyone in the HBPOA in some way needs to contribute to the vision and strategic goals of the HBPOA. Please participate!

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#### **FEBRUARY SPEAKER**



Mr Scott Herring, P.E., serves as the Hernando County Director of Public Works and as the County Engineer since December, 2017. Mr. Herring earned an Engineering Degree from Vanderbilt University, and is registered as a Professional Engineer in Florida and Georgia.

Prior to coming to Hernando County, Mr. Herring spent the previous eight years working for Nassau County, Florida, as the County Public Works Director. In that role, he provided leadership to multiple departments and divisions, delivered results for projects and programs, and prepared the budgets for four separate divisions. While he was originally hired as the Nassau County engineer in August of 2009, Mr. Herring was promoted within a year to be the county public works director in August of 2010.

Additionally, Mr. Herring has been active with various leadership associations and organizations. In 2016, he was presented with the Leadership Nassau Alumni of the Year award. He served as chair of the Technical Coordinating Committee for the North Florida Transportation Planning Organization in 2012 and 2016. He also served as President of the Florida Association of County Engineers and Road Superintendents from 2000 to 2001.
