Bishop Paul Celebrates Mass at Cathedral of the Pines

The Cathedral of the Pines Prayer Service, conducted annually by the Eastern Diocese of the Polish National Church was held on Sunday, July 8, 2012.



The Altar of the Nation is recognized by Congress as a National Memorial to American men and women who lost their lives in war. This year's Mass was dedicated to all those who serve in uniform, both military and civilian, and was concelebrated at the beautiful Altar of the Nation in Rindge NH.

The Mass was attended by approximately 75 members of the diocese, which is headquartered at the Holy Trinity Cathedral in Manchester NH, and includes local parishes in New Hampshire, Massachu-

setts, Connecticut and Rhode Island.

Bishop Paul Sobiechowski, leader of the Eastern Diocese was assisted by priests from Massachusetts, including Fr. Tenus of Lowell; Fr. Czarnecki of Northampton; Fr. Lukaszewicz of Chicopee; Fr. Calvo of S. Deerfield; and Fr. Sr. Banas of Ware. Also assisting the bishop were Fr. Wos of Woonsocket, RI ; Fr. Gitner of Stratford CT and Fr. Smolinski of Manchester, CT.

The homily was preached by our pastor Father Tenus who chose a quote from St. Peter as his theme: "Each one should use whatever gifts he has received to serve others".

Choir members from Lowell, MA, Manchester, NH, Manchester, CT and Plantsville, CT sang together beautifully to the musical accompaniment of Karen Sobiechowski. Joey Grieve, 11, a member of St. Casimir's in Lowell sang two solos during Mass; "Sing to the Mountain" and "God Bless the USA".

Carrying the cross as part of the procession and recession was Bedford police officer Stefan Swiadas who attended the Mass in uniform. During a call for prayers, Swiadas asked that fallen Police Chief Michael Maloney be remembered.

After the service everyone shared a meal together at the Hidden Hills Banquet Hall in nearby Rindge.
