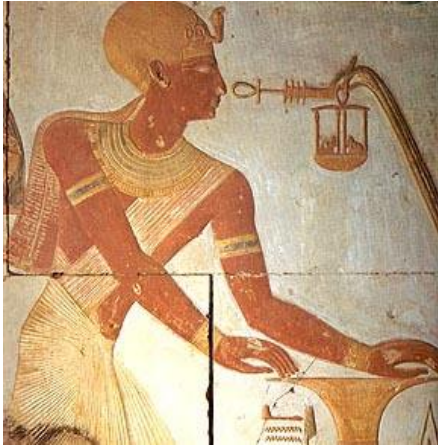

The Amarna Period had caused political, religious and social upheaval and the 18th Dynasty was in its death throes because Tutankhamun, last king of the royal bloodline, had no heir.

Seti I ascended the throne after the death of his father Ramesses I and was the first king to inherit the office from his father since Akhenaten.

Due to the short reign of Ramesses I it essentially fell to Seti I to establish his own legitimacy and that of the dynasty. This lecture looks at the monumental landscape of Seti I at Thebes, his agenda and how he went about establishing that legitimacy.
