



GREAT SALT POND – THURSDAY NIGHT SAILING

July 9–September 10, 2020

Thursday Night Sailing, is a 10 week long round-the-marks summer racing series sailed each Thursday evening in the recreation area of the Great Salt Pond. This event is for the larger keel boats on the Island which sail under a specific handicap rule called the Performance Handicap Rating Fleet (PHRF) and dinghies if there is a large enough participating fleet. First start each Thursday evening is at 6:00 p.m. for the first of three 20 minute races.

The Series was founded in 1999 by local sailors with a goal to foster sailing yacht racing on Block Island. The Series is run by Block Island Community Sailing as an advanced racing clinic with coaching and a weekly newsletter on the Racing Rules of Sailing, boat speed techniques, and racing tactics. Regatta chairman Henry duPont, who is also a CGSP Director, said "This sailing series would not have been possible without the work of CGSP and the Harbors Department to preserve and protect the Great Salt Pond." The racing format is typically a windward/leeward course set in the recreational area in the northern section of the Great Salt Pond. The courses are typically about a mile and a half or twenty minutes long which allows three races to be run each evening. This year the series strictly adhered to RI DOH, DEM, and US Sailing Covid-19 regatta regulations.
