Finlayson, after 1872 [2nd]; d. buried in Finlayson Cemetery, Jefferson Co.) enlisted 3/28/61 at Madison and was appointed 2nd Sgt 8/23/61. He transferred to (Old) Company A, 1st Florida Infantry 1/16/62 and was probably mustered out 4/6/62. He reenlisted 3/26/62 in Company I, 2nd Florida Cavalry at Madison and was promoted 1st Sgt 5/28/62 but was reduced soon after. He was discharged 9/10/62 after substituting R. Mays but reenlisted 8/20/63 at Madison. He transferred to Company F, 5th Florida Cavalry as 2nd Lt in late 1863. His presence was not stated on the last roll and was paroled at Tallahassee 5/12/65. He was 5'8", light eyes, skin & hair. He had four other brothers who served in Florida units: Thomas Williams Mays (Company C, 4th Florida Infantry), James Warren Mays (Company I, 2nd Florida Cavalry), Samuel Pope Mays (Company F, 5th Florida Cavalry) and John Baptist Mays (Company F, 5th Florida Cavalry). Father: Richard Johnson Mays, Sr.; Mother: Eliza Anna Williams.

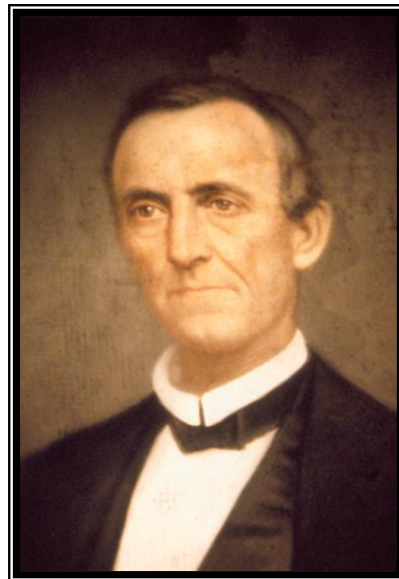

Richard Johnson Mays

Richard J. Mays, born 1808 in Edgefield, SC, migrated to Florida sometime after October 29, 1830, when he married Eliza Anne Williams. Mays, along with his wife, Eliza and daughter Elizabeth, joined his brother, James Mays, James second wife, Miriam Earle Mays and their son, Sam III to begin the long trek to North Florida. Initially they settled near Lake Sampala, in an area called San Pedro, in southern Madison County. This area served as a settlement for other South Carolinians. However, mosquitoes and malaria resulted in the death of their only child, Elizabeth.

In 1833 Richard and Eliza Mays moved to the northern part of the county near the present day town of Lovett. There Richard J. Mays began acquiring land which soon developed into what became known as Glendower Plantation. On the highest point in the area, Mays constructed a two-story, ten-bedroom home known as Clifton Mansion. Between 1833 and 1864 this plantation grew to encompass thousands of acres and produced cotton, timber, and a host of varied livestock.



Ten more children (see will for names, page 211) were born into the Mays home, but only seven survived childhood. To accommodate the educational needs of the children and his neighbors' children, Mays established the Mays Academy at Concord. In time the academy also served to prepare untrained Baptist ministers in their study of the Bible.

Despite the demands of running a prosperous plantation, Richard Mays still found time to accept civic responsibilities. As an example, in 1838, he served as a delegate to a constitution convention that subsequently resulted in the Florida territory becoming a state in 1845. He also served as postmaster from 1835 to 1838. In 1837 Mays was appointed as a justice of the peace. And as a loyal Southerner, he provided supplies and several sons to support the Confederate cause during the Civil war.

More importantly, Richard Mays was a deeply spiritual man. In 1831, Mays joined with several other families and founded the Hickstown Baptist Church, which was the forerunner to the current First Baptist Church of Madison. There he held leadership positions in the Hickstown Church. In 1832 he served as a lay-preacher to the Elizabeth Baptist Church in Jefferson County. This position lasted about a year. By June, 1841, R. J. Mays decided there were sufficient numbers of people to start a church near his plantation. He along with the McCall and Johnson families established the Concord Baptist Church. He gave 20 acres of land for a church site and helped construct the original meeting house out of hand-hewn logs. Soon after the church was constituted Mays asked the church to license and ordain him as a missionary Baptist Preacher. His request was granted. He served at two different times as the pastor of the Concord church, first between 1843 and 1846 and again from 1857 to 1860.

During the next several years, growth of churches throughout Middle Florida along with Florida Baptists' contact with Baptists in Georgia convinced many pioneer Baptists of the need to organize a state convention. R. J. Mays recognized the importance of such an organization and suggested that a meeting of church delegates be held in his home. This was to occur during one of the four days the Florida Association held its annual meeting at the Concord Baptist Church. On November 20, 1854, in the parlor of Mays' Clifton Mansion, the constitution for the Florida Baptist State Convention was drawn up. And on the next day the action was reported to the delegates attending the Florida Baptist Association.

During the latter part of his life, Richard was an invalid suffering from what was probably, stomach ulcers. He died July 18, 1864, and was buried near the church with which he had been so closely associated for nearly thirty years.

Eliza Anne Williams Mays

No account of the life of Richard Johnson Mays would be complete that did not include a tribute to his wife, Eliza, who was an able and worthy helpmate, and in her own right, a very remarkable woman. Married at fourteen years of age, she had had little time for much formal education.

Eliza developed into an industrious, practical, able woman who well fulfilled the requirements of her time and class. She loved and obeyed and somewhat feared her Richard, whom to the end of her twenty-one years of widowhood, she reverently called “Mr. Mays.” She was his able assistant. She managed all the affairs of the home and children, all the activities of the premises and as Richard’s health began to fail, a great part of the plantation responsibilities besides. She had her own slaves and teams for her part of the business, Wagon loads of food, the products of her gardens, poultry-yards, preserve closets, and smoke houses, were constantly on the roads to the nearby town. Her sons vouched for the fact that, in an emergency, she would lend Richard a thousand dollars at a time from her cache in the great mahogany wardrobe in her bedroom. Whether Richard would repay these loans “deponent sayeth not.” Probably, he didn’t. Being an adherent of Paul’s doctrine concerning the subjection of women, he perhaps feared that the possession of too much money might prove a hindrance to Eliza’s spiritual growth.



Eliza was a mighty housekeeper, skilled in all the fine cookery of her day. A list of the dishes that graced her table on festive occasions rivals that of the “Legend of Sleepy Hollow”. She fed her family lavishly and well - too well, in fact, for Richard’s stomach trouble was probably the result of rich food provided by his devoted spouse, and certain it is, that more than one of her children suffered from what was called “dyspepsia”. But all of her sons retained through life, fond recollections of her house-wifely perfections, and “the pies that Mother used to make” was no joke but rather sore subject with some of the daughters-in-law who did not have Eliza’s skill, nor her staff of well-trained servants nor her well filled larder in the lean years that followed “The War”.

Eliza was fair, blue eyed, plump, and talkative; the opposite of Richard, who was slender, serious, with a clear dark complexion, hazel eyes, and a Roman nose. She was never idle for if she sat down a few moments, there would be a mending basket or knitting to engage her nimble fingers. Her delight was in her flower garden, a large rectangular area between the Mansion and the sloping lawn. Here she collected specimens of all the flowers of the land, and they thrive and bloomed for her because she loved them and had a “green hand”.

But after Richard’s death, things went badly at Clifton Mansion and Eliza sorely missed his firm and guiding hand, and his ability to devise new ways and means to deal with new and strange social and economic conditions. Nor were her elder sons, returning from the war, able to advise her, Eight years of college and army life had given little experience in dealing with farm problems; besides, they had their own families to care for, and each established himself on the plantation bequeathed to him in Richard’s will.

Eliza remained at Clifton for eighteen years after Richard’s death. She endeavored to carry out his wishes concerning the education of the younger children, to hold the family together, to keep up his interest in the Concord Church and school and to care for Clifton Mansion and the plantation.

In 1883 Eliza left Clifton and went to live with her daughter in Greenville, SC. She died in 1886

Note: The Clifton property was finally bought by Mr. Dave Wood. The Mansion burned in 1931.

Will of Richard Johnson Mays

As life is at best uncertain, and we should be prepared for it's close by having our house set in order. I do hereby ordain and declare this my last will and testament here in revoking all former wills for the disposition of my effects.

In the first place, as an humbled believer in Jesus Christ as the son of God, the Saviour of sinners and as Jehovah Jesus God manifest in the flesh — God with us — God for us. I commit myself, soul and spirit into His care as one that is able to keep that which is committed to His trust until the great day of God Almighty.

I hereby nominate and appoint my beloved and only wife, Eliza Anna [Williams] Mays, the mother of my children, the executrix of this my last will and testament, and to her I give a child's part of all my possessions, real and personal with the addition of all the household and kitchen furniture, the carriage horses and carriage in which they work, and her share of the land to include the homestead and improvements thereon.

I give to each one of my sons [Richard Johnson II, Thomas Williams, James Warren, Samuel Pope, John the Baptist, and Dannitte Hill II] in their own right and subject to their own disposition a distributive share of my estate to be equitably assigned them as they become of age.

I also give to my daughter, Mary Caroline Mays, a distribution share as to her brother, to be given her on her marriage or becoming of age, with the condition that it belongs to her and the lawful issue of her body, her children, and dying without lawful issue, she may dispose of it by will. If not so disposed of to revert to my estate, to be equally divided among the heirs to the same, and I desire the estate kept together and divided as the child becomes entitled to it.

My wife and executrix shall associate either of my sons or any friend she may please with her in management of the estate. I would most earnestly enjoin on all as the experience of my past life, industry, honesty, temperance, and justice to everyone, a just economy. That will live within ones increase with regular annual settlements with each other and everyone else. Let this be especially regarded that they may preserve their character from suspicion and do that which is right and just to all. In addition, I commit my negroes, not as property, but as human beings to be treated and cared for as such as a charge from God our Maker to them which must not be neglected. It is duly sanctioned by your interest and their welfare. I charge you all before God. See that with kindness not foolish indulgence, and proper consideration for their circumstances and condition. This obligation is felt and discharged.

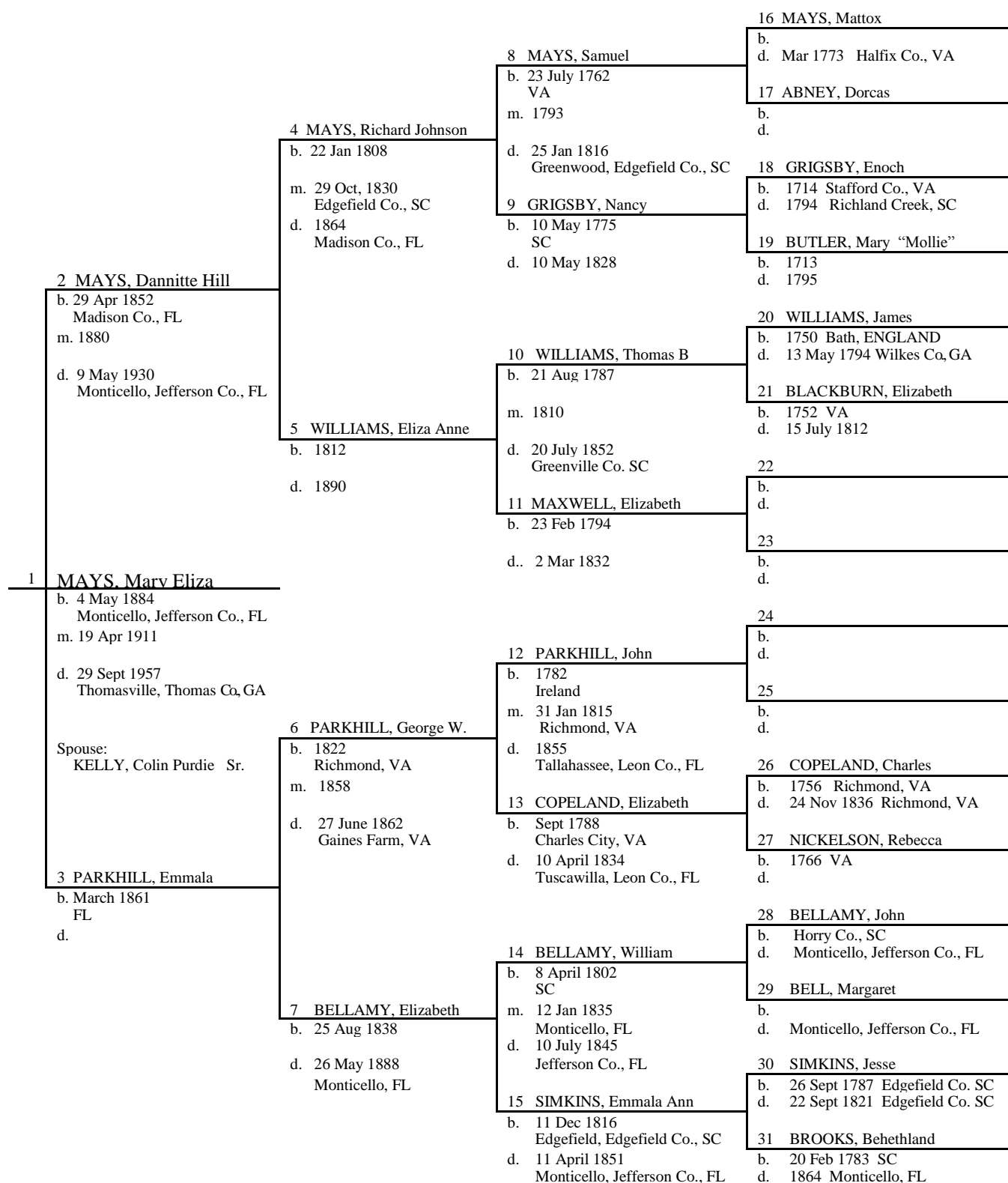

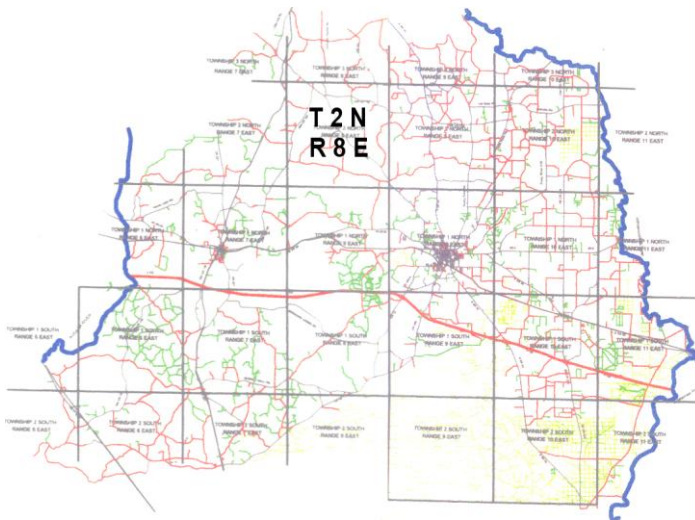

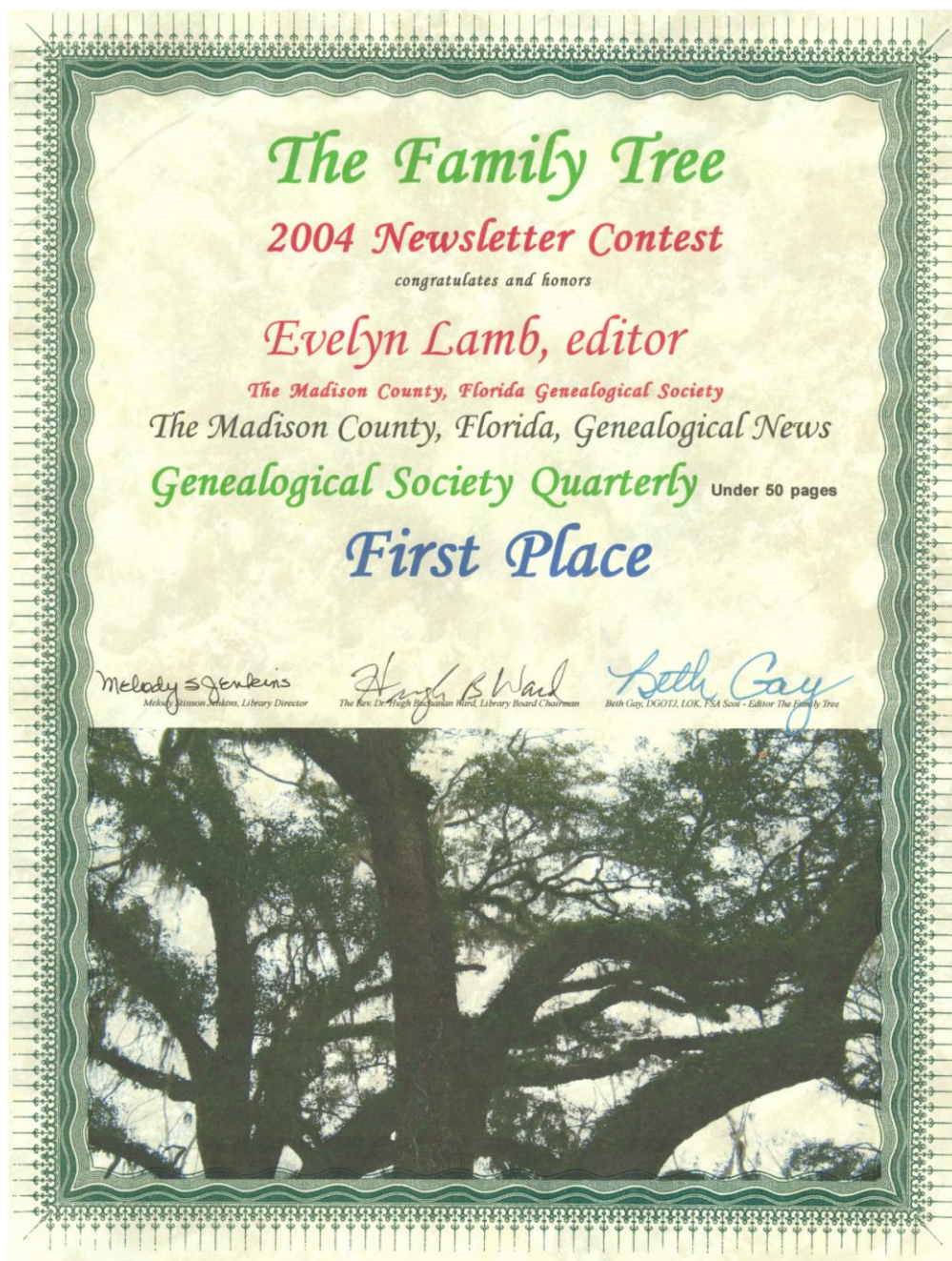
First Place Newsletter
