2019 Thundercar Rookie Eligibility

A driver is eligible for rookie status if they have never competed for more than 33% of events in a previous calendar year in that division OR have not scored points in 4 or more previous division calendar years. Track has final say.

2019 Thundercar Race Lineup Info

- The Speedrome aims to promote balanced competition with its tradition of handicapping the majority of race starting lineups. The main inversion method used since 1995 are rankings with the best ranked drivers starting at the back.
- A ranking chart is a driver's previous finishes in that particular type of event.
 These finishes are organized from best to worst. Drivers tied with an equal finish, will use their next best to break the tie and do so for as many finishes are needed. Drivers with no previous finishes have no ranking and will start behind ranked drivers. Late arriving, non-qualified, or drivers who miss their heat will also start behind ranked drivers.
- Heats will have their own ranking chart.
 Heats are inverted with one heat having the higher ranked drivers and the other having lower ranked drivers and so on.
- Regular features will have their own ranking chart. Lineups are inverted.
- 40-lap features will be half inverted (drivers in competition that night) from current point standings heading into that night.
- On opening night, heats will be inverted using the 2018 final points and the feature will start heads-up from 2018 final points.
