Hear are a few things that are going on in the next few months and we are looking forward to seeing you at these events.

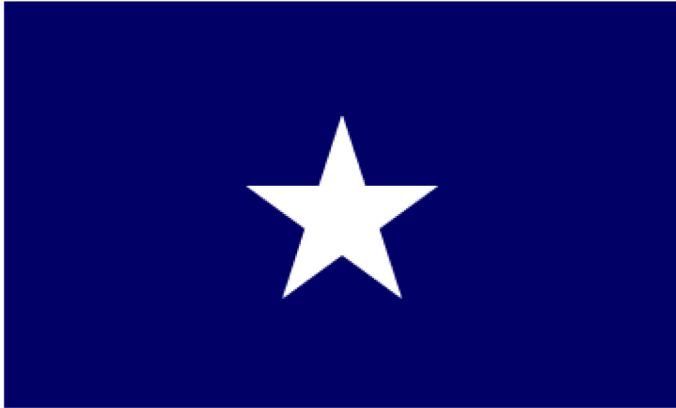
1. December 2nd: Decorate the tree. 11 am

History of the American Flag

Illuminating American History Through the American Flag
Republic of West Florida, September 23-December 7, 1810
Twelfth in a Series

Revolutions come in all shapes and sizes, but the West Florida Rebellion holds the record as the shortest. In less than one minute it was over, setting in motion a chain of events that would transform the United States into a continental and, eventually, world power.

The nascent United States' expansion had begun when President Thomas Jefferson purchased the Louisiana Territory from France in 1803. Spain, which had ceded the territory to Napoleon, maintained that it did not include the area known as West Florida, which stretched from the Perdido River across southern Alabama, Mississippi and Louisiana to the Mississippi River. For its part, the United States believed West Florida was its own, but rather than risk confrontation and war, Jefferson and his successor James Madison allowed Spain to administer it until an opportunity arose.

Things were peaceful until 1808, when Spain appointed Col. Charles Delassus as governor. The inefficiency and corruption of officials under him threatened the prosperity of American colonists in West Florida. The settlers rebelled in 1810 and the Republic of West Florida established a government with its capital at St. Francisville, LA. Under the leadership of President Fulmar Skipwith, the little country existed for seventy-four days from September 23—December 7, 1810. It even created the first lone star flag known as “The Bonnie Blue Flag,”

“Upon learning of the revolt, U.S. President James Madison wanted to move quickly to annex the republic but knew he could not use the military without congressional approval.

Though troubled by ‘constitutional qualms’ Madison did not want to let the opportunity pass unexploited and resorted to the oldest justification in the political book: he acted on the grounds that ‘a crisis has at length arrived subversive of the order of things.’”

December 10, 1810, the Lone Star Flag was lowered, and the Stars and Stripes of the United States flew over West Florida from the Mississippi River to the Pearl River.
