

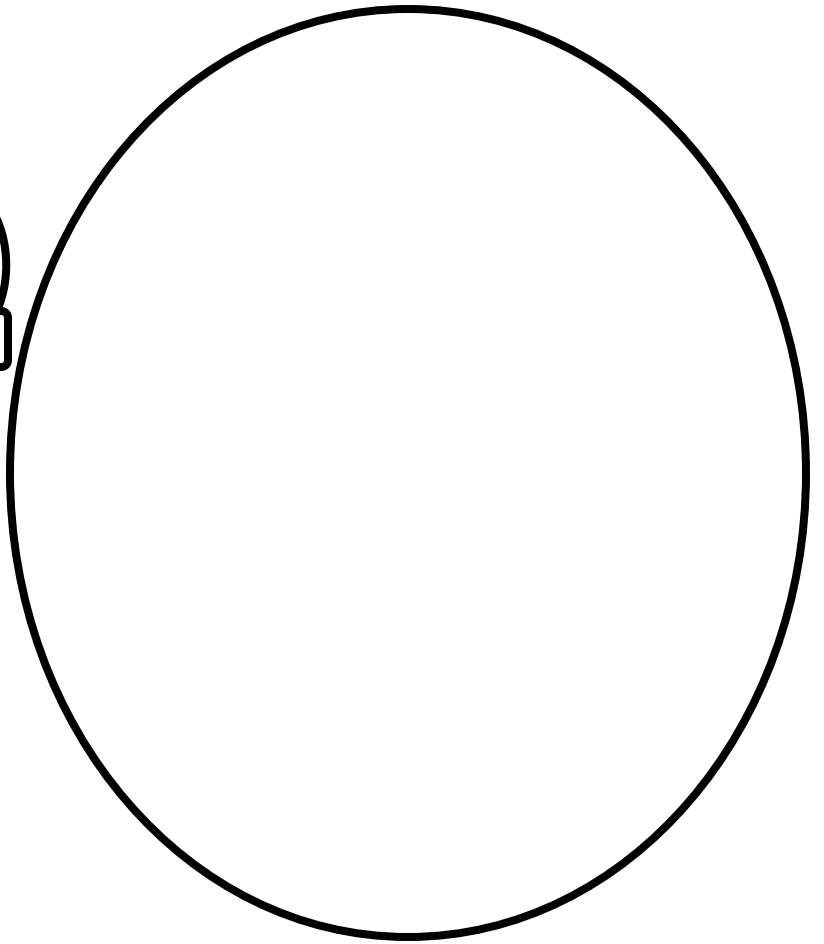
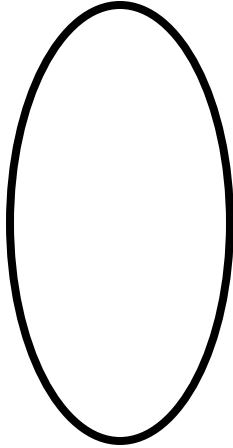
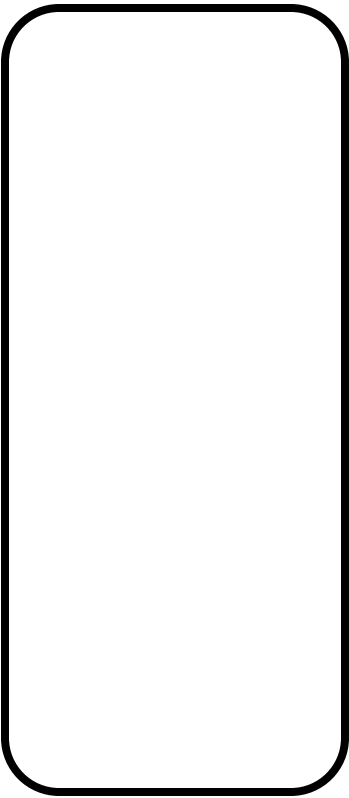


Run mittens (pg 2) off on many different colored sheets of construction paper. Cut the patterns apart. Sort them (or have the students sort them) by shape, and set them at a center.

Prepare the Helping Hands bulletin board. Place some winter objects on it, or add objects as the children make them.

Students will cut out the mittens. They will paste the 3 shapes together (choosing any colors they wish). When a student does something helpful, write it on the mitten and add it to the bulletin board. Do daily wall walks to read the title and the mittens and celebrate all the little helpers!
