

### Families in Faith

This week our 1<sup>st</sup> Communion Class learned about *listening*. They listened to the story of the farmer who sowed seeds. Some landed in the road where the birds ate them. Some landed in the rocks where they could not grow. Some landed in thorns and weeds that choked the growing plants. But some landed on healthy ground, and they grew strong and tall. This week as a family read this story together and pray the Lectio Divina with it. You can find the parable in Matthew 13:3-8

The children also learned about the Liturgy of the Word. This is the first part of the Mass where we sit and *listen* to Scripture. Encourage your child to sit and listen to the Liturgy of the Word at Mass. Ask them questions about the bible readings and the homily.
