- Related to: Adds reference to statutes regarding definitions, endangered species, commercial guides, permit issuance, license required, physicians to report persons bitten by animals, and quarantine of animals suspected of rabies
- Related to: Removes reference to 150.290 and 150.305 regarding wildlife breeder sale and transport and possession out of season
- Authority: Adds local government authority to regulate inherently dangerous animals AND destruction or control of animals causing damage
- Necessity: Adds 50 C.F.R. 21.29 is for holding raptors for falconry purposes
- "Enhanced Rabies Surveillance" replaces area with zone
- "Native wildlife" replaces man with humans, removes exclusion of naturalized introduced species, adds those that have naturally expanded their range into KY without humans
- Rabies vector species now includes hybrids of listed species
- Permits to hold wildlife in captivity – exempts annual transportation permit, falconry permit and captive-bred native wildlife (except fox or coyote) imported or held in temporary facility 10 days; Also limits exemption section to AZA
- Northern bobwhite – shooting areas must comply with 301 KAR 2:041 regarding shooting areas
- Snapping turtle – limited to common snapping and references the law regarding turtle take
- Bullfrogs – can only be taken during season and references rule
- Spring lizards – removes from 25 limit and references live bait for personal use rule for dusky salamanders
- Falconry permit – ADDS exemption from noncommercial permit and transportation permit for those raptors
- Rabies Vector Species (RVS) – adds reference to furbearer trapping law, requires all RVS trapped to be dispatched (replaces euthanized) unless immediately released – keeps fox and coyote for foxhound enclosure exemption but allows all not just those in the designated area
- RVS transport ban – limits to living ones and replaces area with zone
- Captive wildlife permit – exempts captive-bred native wildlife imported or held in temporary facility 10 days (except fox, coyote)
- Requires permit holders to report bites and exposure to local county health department in 12 hours
- Requires immediate dispatching of mammals that bite person or show rabies symptoms and submit head for testing – department shall confiscate if not complied with
- Commercial permit – ADDS those profit in any way from native wildlife need permit (exempts imported captive-bred wildlife or held in facility 10 days) AND requires permit per facility
- Noncommercial permit – excludes those profiting from the native captive wildlife in any way AND requires permit per facility
- Transport permit – limits to native species and that receipt of shipment limited to those from outside state
- Applications:
 - moves age, fee, and submitting application from reason for denial to application requirements and
 - ADDS valid email
 - lists permits required
 - gives new residents with transportation permit 30 days to get inspection and submit application

- exempts government agencies doing conservation from fees
- Also requires USFWS permit for MBTA or exemption
- federal endangered limited to AZA, USFWS permit or cooperator in AZA SSP
- Annual transportation permit – amendments must be submitted by mail or email and must not ship until approved
- Law compliance – must comply with all federal, state and local laws regarding wildlife in general
- Prohibited species:
 - Exemptions – adds trapped RVS, wildlife rehabilitation permit, commercial nuisance wildlife control
 - transport – limits to into KY
 - ADDS native bats, bobcat, hellbender, Kirtland’s snake, otter, native RVS, and wild rabbits
- Exemptions:
 - Adds subsection titles
 - Updates name of AZA – makes them exempt for captive wildlife permits - allows them to have federal endangered and prohibited for official zoo activities – requires prohibited species to be in enclosure to prevent escape and prevent public contact
 - Commissioner’s exemption – only required to consider exemption and must further purposes of fish and game statutes – replaces licensed or accredited research or educational institution – limits government agency to those conducting research or education at permanent wildlife center – limits colleges to those conducting research or education to fulfill classroom requirement
- Grandfathering: ADDS MAY exempt prohibited owned 4/4/23 – must microchip RVS, bobcats and otters and report using official form – BANS transfer ownership except owner’s death, reproducing and replacing them – enclosure must prevent escape and public contact
- Enclosures: excludes dog training enclosures from requirements – clarifies that permittee must only meet the minimum requirements
- Mobile facility: requires those held in mobile facility more than 10 days to meet general caging requirements
- Inspections: replaces permit revocation with access – allows inspections of property holding facilities are on – inspection failure is if any deficiencies found or not allowed inspection and given 10 days to correct – must allow inspections
- Permit denial and revocation: NEW section
 - Denial: revises old denial reason for violating this regulation and the exotic wildlife one by adding shooting area, import of game birds, falconry, shoot-to-retrieve field trial, furbearer seasons AND includes statutes and federal laws regarding hunting, fishing or wildlife, violating any department regulation, providing false information and failing inspection – REPLACES acquisition before receiving permit with captive wildlife permit, transportation permit, or commissioner's exemption
 - Revocation: adds same text as denial – adds if permit is revoked then all their facility permits are
 - Denial period: creates denial period for revoked or suspended permits
- Commissioner’s exemption: may revoke if enclosures fail to prevent escape or public contact, not complying with exemption letter provisions, other reason to protect public health and safety, native ecosystems, native wildlife – if revoked must remove prohibited from state in 48 hours

- Confiscation: requires seizure if permit or commissioner’s exemption revoked or not acquired – must be released, transferred or dispatched (RVS immediately dispatched) – does not allow return to owner – allows surrendering
- Administrative Hearing: also allows for denials – must be in writing and postmarked or hand delivered in 30 days
