

Important Update Regarding Gila National Forest Trip, June 22-24.

### June 22, 23 and 24, 2012. Gila National Forest, Glenwood and Luna areas

Mark will go up Friday the 22nd and will be camping in the Pueblo Campground for those that wish to camp. For those wishing not to camp, there are motels in Glenwood, NM.





We'll meet Saturday arrivals at 11:00 a.m. at the Ranger Station at the south end of Glenwood. We will visit the Luna-Reserve area with a good chance of Lewis's Woodpeckers and Pinyon Jay. Also there are some prairie dogs in the area.

We'll then go over to Luna Lake for lunch, where we might see mergansers and a possible Bald Eagle. Other places we might bird will be the fish hatchery in Glenwood for Summer Tanagers and flycatchers, the Catwalk for American Dipper and a stop at Mangas Springs for the Common Black-Hawk.



### AT FEATHER LAKE

Feather Lake remains dry and closed to public use. Rain on May 9-10 put a little water in the central part of the basin, but it lasted only 2 days. The lake has now been completely dry for 14 of the past 19 months and mostly dry the other 5 months. In and around the basin, it appears over half the lake's willows and cottonwoods are either dead or severely stressed.

Next door at Feather Lake II, the basin is at a lower elevation than the Feather Lake basin, hence closer to the water table. Though Feather Lake II has been dry since last October, there is new cattail and bulrush growth within the basin, and the young willows and cottonwoods along its margins continue to do well. Thanks to the work by Boy Scout Troop 4 last August, few saltcedars are present.

We look forward to Feather Lake flooding again during this year's rainy season. Will it happen? Join us for our next workday to find out. It takes place **Sat.**, **August 11** starting at **8 a.m.** Join us to help with sanctuary maintenance. Feather Lake is located at 9500 North Loop at Bordeaux in El Paso, 0.3 miles west of Americas Ave.

Audubon at RIO BOSQUE WETLANDS PARK





### **Notes From the Field**

### Prairie Chicken, Bitter Lake NWR, Bottomless Lakes SP, Roswell & Rattlesnake Springs, April 13-15, 2012.

Great trip! Despite the wind, we had 69 species and great, long looks at Lesser Prairie-Chickens. We were in place on the lek by 5:30 a.m. and the prairie-chickens didn't let us down! The males were displaying in all their glory!

We want to thank Dan Baggao, Wildlife Biologist, Roswell Field Office of the BLM, for his assistance in helping us locate the prairie-chickens and other birding areas.

Other highlights were Scissor-tailed Flycatchers, Swainson's Hawk on nest, Golden Eagle, Prairie and Peregrine falcons, Osprey eating a fish on the Pecos River, Franklin's Gulls and Western Bluebirds.

### Chiricahua Mountains & Southeastern Arizona, May 25-28, 2012.

The area is coming back after the fires and the birding was great. We had a total of 82 species! The highlight was a great, long look at two male trogons! We were able to view them for about 15 minutes. It couldn't get much better than that. We also did some owling and, thanks to John Groves' expertise, we got a good look at a Whiskered Screech-Owl and heard lots of Elf Owls. Also heard was a Great Horned Owl. We had 5 species of hummingbirds, lots of Acorn Woodpeckers, Mexican Chickadee, Mexican Jay,

three species of orioles, Hepatic and Western tanagers, Buff-bellied Flycatcher just to name a few and got into about 12 javelinas in downtown Portal. We saw lots of deer and a Chiricahua

Animas Creek lies west of Caballo Lake and contains the only Arizona Sycamores east of the Continental Divide. The Brown-crested Flycatcher nests here, and we hope to see Summer Tanagers, Bridled Titmouse and Cassin's Kingbird. We will bird this area from the road.

ing lot at the El Paso Outlet Mall at I-10 and Transmountain.
