FOLLOWING THE RESURRECTION OF JESUS

There was not a needy person among them. Acts 4:34a (NRSV)

Easter is over. Now what? St. John's UCC experienced two Easter worship services, enjoyed a tasty breakfast and watched the children hunt Easter eggs. The pomp and circumstance of this Holy Day is over, and as a pastor, I wonder how we can continue to be Easter people in our modern world.

Do not take me wrong, I truly enjoyed all the Easter festivities; however, I wonder how many of us will contemplate and reach deep into our souls and ask the questions, "What does Easter and the resurrection of Jesus mean to me and the modern church — St. John's UCC?" And "How will we share the good news?"

The first Christians certainly did. In Acts, whenever they met, "the apostles gave their testimony to the resurrection of the Lord Jesus." Surely they included their own stories, like Peter's transformation from a fisherman into a preacher or Mary Magdalene's experience as the first witness to the Resurrection.

Yet, Acts 4:34 doesn't include such personal testimonies. Instead it tells of a community testimony. The first Christians gave up their possessions, just as Jesus had given up his life for others. The early church made sure no one was in need, just as Jesus ensured five thousand hungry people were fed, sick people healed and troubled people comforted and loved.

The new Christian community wasn't focused on seeing the Risen Body of Christ, but on **being** the Risen Body of Christ and **doing** what Jesus had done. They didn't just proclaim God's resurrection power. They became that power by offering new life to others.

St. John's does a great job at helping the needy during the operation of the Shalom food pantry. There are many other ways we can be the hands and feet of Jesus in our modern world. St. John's will have the opportunity to visit a sister church, Washington UCC in Cincinnati, the week of July 7. This mission experience will allow us to witness poverty firsthand and how poverty effects people's lives. It was my work as a social worker witnessing how poverty effects lives that led me to change my perception of the poor and enter the ministry.

Our world needs the power and witness of the resurrection more than ever. It also needs the church—St. John's United Church of Christ—to be an Easter people by giving of ourselves and our possessions. The first Christians knew they were living God's new life where no one was in need. They knew this was the way of the Risen Body of the Risen Christ.

Moving On



The same week that I am writing this article, in April, I attended the closing (sale) of my family's small farm just west of Dayton. For various reasons, the farm I always assumed that I would own someday, now belongs to someone else. Though I don't own that house and land that my father's parents moved to when he was two years old in 1923, I still have all the memories of my own and the stories I heard about that place.

Even though I never experienced the depression of the 1930's, I learned of it through my father's stories. Stories of how they made do. My father's dad suffered from crippling arthritis in his 40's, making small time farming more difficult than I can imagine. But somehow they survived by everyone else in the family doing more. I haven't milked many cows by hand, but I remember what my grandfather, Harry O. Shank's hands looked like a gnarled mess not very good for milking. But they had an advantage of being within six or eight miles of the street market in Dayton. So, they worked, milked, grew feed, made butter, gathered eggs and in my dad's words "stood on market" and sold what they had. One thing that he taught me about the depression was that growing food and feeding yourself was good, but if you had something you could sell for a little cash, it made all the difference in the world. They certainly weren't rich. but he told me stories of having a nickel to go see a movie and even get a bottle of pop. Something that many couldn't afford.

I also learned that they did what they could for others. A family we grew up with in our church, Bear Creek Church of the Brethren, had six children, same as our family, with similar ages. The parents are still alive, in their mid-nineties and the father still recalls walking to our farm in the 30's and receiving milk and whatever could be spared. His parents didn't farm, so they had very little. He grew to be a very successful business owner and they always did a lot for us, because he remembered. His son stopped at the farm on one of my last days there while I was clearing some things out, allowing me to use their business scrap collection to save me a lot of time. I was reaping the grace paid forward by my ancestors.

The land that I helped my father farm, then farmed myself for 14 years, will be cared for by someone else now. The house that my father was raised in, as well as myself and my 5 siblings, now belongs to others. It belongs to a good man from a good family someone that rode the school bus with my brother and sister. I went with my Mom to buy eggs at his parent's farm when I was a kid. Time moves on and we change, but I will remember.
