



Attention: All Legion Members!

Post 346 is requesting that each member provide a redacted copy of their DD-214 separation document to the Post. This is due to recently passed legislation, requiring veteran affiliated non-profit 501(c) 19 organizations, such as our American Legion Post 346, to have a copy of each member's DD-214 on file, as part of our Post records. In order for us to be in compliance, should an audit of our records be conducted by the IRS, we need each member to please provide a redacted copy of your DD-214 as soon as possible.

We realize that each individual's DD-214 contains personal and/or medical information, which is why we emphasize that you provide a redacted copy (sensitive information blacked out) as opposed to an original copy. Copies provided to the Post must have your name, department, component and branch of service, and record of service dates, all other personal information may be redacted. All copies to be forwarded to Sr. Vice/Service Officer Tony Mallia, DD-214 copies can be mailed to the Post in care of Tony Mallia or given to him at upcoming meetings. He will be responsible for the safe-keeping of these documents. If you cannot locate a copy of your DD-214, please contact Tony Mallia via the Post, phone: 248-310-4190 or email to: AMNOVI1@att.net

Making military absentee voting easier

The Federal Voting Assistance Program (FVAP) administers the federal responsibilities of the Uniformed and Overseas Citizens Absentee Voting Act (UOCAVA) of 1986. In a recent survey, it was discovered that in the 2008 election alone, 22 percent of absentee voters, both military and overseas civilians, failed to receive their absentee ballot. The average military voter is far more likely to have his ballot rejected than the average voter, either as a result of improper procedure or late arrival. It is necessary that email and online transmission options are available to all Uniformed Service members, and overseas citizens, and that they become the principal methods of sending election materials to these citizens. It is also crucial that the States expand the use of email and online transmission for all elections materials. - from Wikipedia

South Dakota is doing just that. SD has unveiled a new system to ensure that military personnel can exercise their right to vote even when deployed overseas. Dubbed the "Innovative Overseas Absentee Balloting System" or iOASIS, the system combines computer technology and the Common Access Card (CAC) issued by the DoD to enable deployed forces to securely request, obtain and return an absentee ballot. The Sioux Falls Business Journal reports "The system allows service members to use the cameras on electronic devices such as iPads or smartphones, to scan the barcode on their CAC. Once logged in to the system, the service member can register to vote or complete a ballot online. Once filled out, the service member prints it, signs it and mails it like any other absentee voter would. iOASIS turns a "60 day process into less than a 5 minute transaction." Although the system uses online technology, it's not online voting because it still requires the voter to print and mail his or her ballot. SD Secretary of State Jason Grant says "They risk their lives defending our right to vote. We need to defend theirs." South Dakota is the only state handling military overseas voting in this manner.
