During early voting and on Election Day on June 10, fewer than 1 out of 7 registered voters in San Antonio decided who will lead our community for a two-year term (for City Council members) and four-year term (for Mayor).

While it was a runoff election, which notoriously has lower voter turnout versus general elections, the fact that the race for San Antonio Mayor was contested should have spurred more people to come to the polls.

It did not. In all, a little more than 99,000 voters in San Antonio - out of a pool of more than 750,000 registered voters - turned out to decide the mayoral race.



In District 10, which includes Royal Ridge, 14,000-plus voters turned out between early voting and Election Day voting. That's encouraging,

because it represents the second-highest voter turnout among the six contested City Council races. Only District 9 had more voters cast ballots, with 16,900-plus people taking part in the election of their city council representative.

In Royal Ridge, Election Day numbers were pretty good. Exactly 200 people showed up at Royal Ridge Elementary School on June 10 to pull the lever for mayor and District 10 City Councilman. Some District 2 voters also call Royal Ridge Elementary home to their polling location. The District 10 race, which represents the Royal Ridge neighborhood, was the driver for voters.

Civic engagement has always been a hallmark of

our community. One of the priorities for the Royal Ridge Neighborhood Association will be to urge our newly elected District 10 City Councilman, Clayton Perry, for better traffic enforcement in our neighborhood. Specifically, we are concerned about speeding in and around the elementary school as parents have been known to speed at 40 to 50 mph on the way to drop off their kids at school. Our goal is to have an officer with a radar gun set up periodic checkpoints to stop, warn and possibly ticket drivers to discourage this dangerous trend.

Yet our priorities also need to be your priorities. We urge you to contact your elected neighborhood association board members and tell us what YOU want from your city leaders. Our collected voices should have more weight in making our community safer, better and more welcoming.

Another long hot summer is underway. And with it, some miscreants appear to be coming out in the overnight hours.

Contemporaneous and anecdotal reports gathered from Spotcrime.com, LexisNexis.com, NextDoor.com, and the San Antonio Police Department (SAPD) Calls for Service web page suggest thefts from vehicles and actual vehicle thefts increased in early June both within Royal



Ridge and in nearby neighborhoods. Most overnight crimes are discovered in the mornings or even later in the day as folks go about their normal routine.

The crimes are not concentrated in any one particular area but seem to be somewhat evenly distributed suggesting the criminals move about and randomly chose targets of opportunity. In some instances, vehicles were rummaged on being discovered unlocked and in others the vehicles were broken into where something of value was left in plain sight. Generally, locked vehicles and vehicles not "displaying" something of value are not disturbed even if left on the street or in a driveway. The safest way of course to protect your vehicle is to park it in your garage.

Certainly we don't have a lot of folks out in the wee hours of the morning but we have a few to include some Citizens on Patrol (COP) patrols. We encourage those who might be out at those times, and everyone at anytime, to report any and all suspicious persons, vehicles, and activities to the SAPD on their nonemergency number, 207-SAPD (207-7273).

Give the description of the people, vehicle, or activity best you can but don't let the lack of detail deter you from making the call. Even limited information is often sufficient for SAPD to intercept and interview the folks described. Certainly there are few candidates in the wee hours and so calls at those times may be particularly productive for us and the SAPD.

The apparent uptick in vehicle crimes may have abated by the time you read this but the advice is timeless. See something, say something! Anytime and every time! Many have heard my encouragement to overcome their reluctance to call. If you ask yourself a second time whether or not to call, you've asked the wrong person. Call 207-SAPD (207-7273) and talk with the dispatcher!

The next edition of the *Royal Ridge Recorder* will

likely hit the streets after the next SAPD COP training class. While the date has not yet been announced, I anticipate, based on prior year schedules, it will be held on the second Saturday in September, i.e. Sep 9th, 9 AM - 1 PM. Pencil it in on your calendar now and we will update you by email when the actual calendar is published.

The heat is on! Keeping with tradition on Memorial Day weekend, the RRRC Club and Pool Open House was held on Saturday – Monday, May 27-29. The turnout was GREAT. MANY NEW Members came out to enjoy the amenities of their membership.

On Saturday, May 27, we offered door prizes along with our Fundraiser Plate Sale. The Fundraiser Plate Sale yielded \$364. Visitors took advantage of our Concessions over the three-day weekend and helped add to the pot.

Club membership is around 162 members at the time of my article submission, June 24. This is the most members we have had in a long time. The membership numbers are great however financially we are short from last year. Last year we had 110 members at \$225 yielding \$24,750. Below is this year's breakdown:

127 at \$125 = \$15,875
5 at \$150 = \$750
30 at \$175 = \$5,250
Yielding = \$21,875
Shortfall = \$2,875

In order to break even for our annual costs, we need at least 16 extra memberships at \$175. We truly value each and everyone's membership however we are also striving to keep up with the operation costs of the facilities.

Our goal is be able to build up a "rainy day" fund. Keep in mind that our facilities are 30+ years old. Any major repair in our air conditioning (AC), pool pumps and filters, or plumbing will put a large dent in our yearly operational costs. As in any household, we want to be ahead of the game.

Keeping on a positive note, we hope that we will reach our needed amount of memberships. A HUGE Thank You to ALL who included added donations to their memberships ranging from \$5 to \$500. Your generosity is truly appreciated and acknowledged.

At the time of our last article submission, our 2nd annual Fiesta FUN Friday had not yet taken place.

We brought a little bit of Fiesta to our neighborhood and took our April monthly social up a notch or two. Fiesta Fun Friday was held on Friday, April 21. It was set in a Night in Old San Antonio (NIOA) style atmosphere. Participants enjoyed brats and sauerkraut in the German area; chicken fried rice, egg rolls, and fortune cookies in the Chinese area; and taco-chalupa bar in the Mexican area along with an assortment of Mexican pastries and bunuelos. 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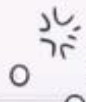
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Red Floats at the Concession Stand. Our concessions netted \$268. This event consisted of family fun with goodie bags handed out to the kiddos.
