MARINE DOWN, SO LONG BLU



A.F. "Blu" Blumenthal, age 81 of Columbus Township passed away on Tuesday July 20, 2021; surrounded by his children & family

Blu entered the Corps in 1956 and was discharged in Sept. 1962. He went through boot camp in San Diego and afterwards on to Camp Pendleton for ITS (Infantry Training School.) He was assigned 1st Battalion, 9th Marines N. Camp Fuji Japan. While there, he climbed to the top of Mount Fuji twice, elevation: 12,388 feet. Of the entire regiment, he was the first to reach the top on that first climb. He remembers, "what a view from the top!" He could see clear to the ocean.

In Sept. 1957 his regiment left the Fuji Camp for Okinawa, then on to the Philippines and later Formosa (Taiwan). In June 1958 Blu returned to Camp Pendleton, COMM Company, he had a double MOS as a rifleman and a radio operator.

When the Corps asked for volunteers in Oct. 1958 to do a tour of duty at MB/NAS (Marine Barracks/Naval Air Station) Kodiak Island, Blu was among them. At that time Alaska was a territory, but in July 1959, Blu was the corporal in charge of the color guard that mounted the first 49 star US Flag at the Naval Base. He reminisced "when the territory became a state, the base lost their overseas pay - \$10 a month!" From Feb.1960 to Sept.1962 Blu was in Fort Benning Georgia for jump school, then was assigned to 2nd Force Recon Company. Training included SCUBA school in St Thomas V.I., and Pathfinder school... "We'll put you in a cold one and get you out of a hot one."

After leaving the Marine Corps, Blu joined the Mt. Clemens Police Dept and retired after 26 years as Detective Sergeant. Blu also spent 23 years (1969-1992) as instructor and unit commander of the Young Marines of Macomb County and was named Instructor of the Year by them.

In Sept. 1969 Blu joined the MCL Wallace B. Emery detachment which later became the Macomb County Detachment. A Life Member, he held every office but one (Chaplain.) He was honored by the Detachment as Marine of the year in 1977 and 1984, and also by the Dept. of MI in 1977.

In his own words....

I grew up in Sterling heights MI in the exact city where I reside now. I went to Boot Camp at Parris Island, South Carolina on May 20th,1993. I then went on to SOI (School of Infantry) at Camp Geiger, a satellite facility of Camp Lejeune in North Carolina on August of 1993 for basic rifleman training after boot camp. Next, I went onto MOS school for 3361 Subsistence Supply Clerk and graduating from there in Dec 1993 I was given my first orders to a duty station for Camp Fuji, Japan.



I was to supply the food to the Mess halls that had both permanent personnel as well as the training units that came in at North Camp. I was meritoriously promoted to Lance Corporal as the only person above me was a Gunny and then the Colonel of the Base. So, the Staff Sergeants didn't like that a Lance Corporal was telling them NO on certain orders of food.

I had the privilege of climbing Mount Fuji to several different levels and got a stamped walking stick on the way up. I then got orders to go to Camp Pendleton (Edson Range) California at the end of 2005 where I was working with Drill Instructors daily and having recruits call me Sir. That was a little different as well. I had them clean my refrigerators and freezers.

I decided to cross train at that time to become a cook and at times cook up to 2,000 meals for breakfast, lunch and dinner for permanent personnel as well as recruits who were doing the rifle range at boot camp for San Diego MCRD. While I was there, we were awarded the Nay-Hill award in the year of 1996. This award means we were the best mess hall in the world on any Marine base as far as Operations, Cleanliness and Food Quality.

I then went from Active duty to reserves in Selfridge Air National Guard base in Mount Clemens, Mi. I chose to switch MOS's to 1141 to become an Electrician. I did a total of 11 years in the Corps and got out as a Sergeant. I decided to use my G.I. Bill and got an Associates' degree in Computer Networking, a Certification in Information Security and a Lean Six Sigma Green Belt. (Six Sigma is a methodology based on statistical analysis rather than guesswork to improve processes with unknown problems.)

Currently I am managing the Detachment's Facebook page and website; looking for any events to bring more awareness to the Marine Corp League and

HISTORIAN'S CORNER

This month in Marine Corps History

1 August 1944: After nine days of fighting in a battle termed "the perfect amphibious operation of World War II," MajGen Harry Schmidt, commander of V Amphibious Corps, declared the island of Tinian secured. The combination of surprise, heavy preassault bombardment, and effective logistical support was responsible for Tinian's recapture with a much lower casualty rate (344 killed and 1550 wounded) than had been experienced in previous landings.


3 August 1950: Eight Corsairs of VMF-214, the famed "Black Sheep" squadron of World War II, launched from the USS SICILY and executed the first Marine aviation mission in the Korean War in a raid against enemy installations near Inchon. After the F4Us delivered their incendiary bombs and rockets on their targets, the Marines concluded their greeting to the Communist troops with a series of strafing runs.

21 August 1968: PFC James Anderson, Jr., was posthumously awarded the Medal of Honor by Secretary of the Navy, Paul R. Ignatius, for heroism in Vietnam while serving as a rifleman with Company F, 2d Battalion, 3d Marines in February 1967. This was the first Medal of Honor presented to an African-

American Marine. His parents, Mr. and Mrs. James Anderson, Sr., received the award during ceremonies at Marine Barracks, 8th and I.

23 August 1984: The last Marines to serve peace-keeping duty in Lebanon arrived home. The 24th Marine Amphibious Unit (MAU) arrived off the coast of Lebanon on 9 April to relieve Marines of the 22d MAU who were guarding the U.S. Embassy in Beirut. The 24th MAU left Beirut on 31 July, marking the last presence of U.S. combat troops in Beirut since Marines entered almost two years earlier.
