#### A Message from Pastor Robert.....

Brothers and sisters in Christ,

...And so, it has officially begun, the Christmas season is upon us. I will now acknowledge the existence of the Christmas items that have littered the shelves for over a month, thus accepting the gift fest that is to come. Yet before that can happen, we must take a journey through Advent, also known as the Holiday Shopping Season here in the US. Yet Advent is actually meant to be more than that. It's true! Advent is not just supposed to be about shopping and frantically running around making sure everything is taken care of before welcoming guests, and/or travelling to visit family and friends, or to get away from said people.

will be delivered to the pantry.




