We thank and commend all of you for saying "YES", and for doing such a great job! - Ella Everett & Ruth McKitric





After giving a penitent his penance during the sacrament of reconciliation, he said, "Can I get a harder penance?" This humble request of the penitent made me begin to wonder how we as penitents view penance?

**FORGIVEN** It is important to note that the penance we receive during confession is not punishment in whatever form. It is not a punishment for the sins confessed, such that not carrying them out forgiveness is not assured. Or through it one can

buy or pay for God's forgiveness and grace. It is rather a discipline – a discipline of our body, mind, heart, and spirit. Such discipline ought not to be carried out just for the moment following confession. As such, it ought to be an ongoing experience in our constant struggle with the power of sin and death. In other words, I believe penance is not a momentary disciplinary action that follows only immediately after confession. It should rather be a continuous disciplinary action putting the penitent continually in the state of grace.

As a discipline, it is an expression of a heart that is contrite and humble, leading to atonement. It begins with the penitent acknowledgement of his/her encounter with the merciful Christ. The example of Matthew the Tax Collector in Matt. 9:9-13 may help to explain this better. Matthew's gracious and merciful encounter with Jesus Christ moved him to willingly and happily repay those he had unjustly cheated.

Penance draws us closer to Christ, our first Love, and our true prize. It helps us to fix our eyes on the prize. Like the Psalmist says, "I lift up my eyes to the mountain – where does my help come from? My help comes from the Lord, who made heaven and earth" (Ps. 121:1-2). It helps the penitent to realize the abundance of the grace of God at work in him or her. For where sin abounds, grace abounds even more (Rom. 5:20). (Part 1, part 2, next Sunday)
