When you come to our September membership meeting, you'll also receive the up-dated treasurer's report. I did not have all the answers at the May membership meeting but I knew we'd find the answers. I also knew that we, as your Board, had not gone "over-budget" on any

item, and that on most budget items we'd spent way below the funds allotted by the budget. HAPT's main source of income is, of course, our conference held in February. This year's conference was one of the very few in HAPT's history that we actually lost money!! One reason was that hotel costs have gone up dramatically! Hotels charge per attendee for food, etc. That charge, per person, was \$68.37 in 1999 and this year it was \$102.90!! Not only did we have less attendees this February, but hotel costs, per person, were each approximately 50% higher!!

Things are looking up, though! Our conference in 2007 will be held on February 9 & 10<sup>th</sup>. It will be held at the Ala Moana Hotel, which gave us the best rates. It will feature, as Presenter, none other than the world revered child and adolescent psychologist, Play therapy supervisor, and author and editor of more than 43 books, Charles Schaefer, Ph.D. In his training entitled "Evidence-Based Play Therapy Interventions", he will be providing us with data on research results which many will be very interested in. Having Dr. Schaefer in Honolulu is a great honor, and our audience should be correspondingly large. Register early!!

Speaking of Conferences, the APT conference in October will be held in Toronto, Canada, and will feature experts in child and family therapy and various applications of play therapy from every state in the union and from other countries, too. Because of my attendance at the APT conference last year, I was able to pre-pay for the conference for \$199.00 for the two main conference days. ## Sandplay Therapists of Hawaii Present: Martin Kalff

The November 14th lecture will discuss the capacity of play to enable the move toward wholeness as shown in Greek philosophy, the Bible, Indian mythology, Buddhist philosophy and Psychology with examples that show the deeper the meaning of play activity.

The November 15th seminar will look at the basis of a series of sandplay images by a child. In this example we will examine how the dynamics of spontaneous play can help to overcome anxiety and depressed states of mind. The case study shows both how in the process of play a sense of inner security through the connection to Self in the sense of C.G. Jung has been established and also illustrates the steps towards the transformation of the shadow that is the transformation of disturbing and anxiety provoking elements in the psyche.
