September 1, 2019 Twenty-Second Sunday in Ordinary Time Lk 14:1, 7-14

Dear St Pius X and St Anthony Church,

The higher they rise, the harder they fall! Jesus is offering some leadership training to his disciples, revealing to them the principle of social gravity: the natural tendency for rising stars to fall (& for inflated egos to burst). Jesus says in Luke 14:11, "Everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, but the one who humbles himself will be exalted." As a pre-emptive caution to prevent a humiliating fall, stay close to the ground-stay humble. It is as if Jesus is saying, "You can leave open an escape hatch upward, but always work for more grounded and humble positions for yourselves." Jesus' parable advises that, "When you enter a banquet, take the lowest place." Being humble leaves you growth space upward (rising room), but also limits possible humiliating demotions. We need to stay realistic and down to earth about ourselves. Pride 'sets one up' to stumble. Proverbs 16:18 tells us straight, that 'Pride goes before the fall'. Naturally, pride thinks too much of itself. So, everybody has got it coming. I can't remember who once humorously said, "Humble yourself or any opponent will gladly do it for you!" In our screen age of shows and stages, I imagine the red carpets of Hollywood bleed green with envy. But ego and pride were not born in 2019. I ran across this curious note recently reading a journal diary from the 1960's of a biographer of Thomas Merton. The biographer noted how 'tiresome' journal reading becomes when you realize it is a "peacock's dance", because the authors are always writing polished prose for publication (with that author cleverly writing that in a journal entry!). Was that only an empty confession, or is it ego-blindness? But ego has been with us from the beginning of time, in Genesis. If Pride is the selfish fruit of Adam and Eve's garden, it seems like Envy was the jealous harvest of Cain's fields. Such sinful selfishness is something for all of us to work down. Maybe it is the sin of trying to be original with everything??

But as our Good Savior, Jesus provides the solution. He teaches humility from the beginning. His first major sermon (on the Mount!) includes this line, "Blessed are the meek, for they will inherit the land" (Matthew 5:5). Also, early in Luke's gospel, He taught, "Whoever wishes to save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for my sake will save it" (9:24). He then goes on to break that down as simply meaning, "For the one who is least among you is the one who is the greatest." (Luke 9:48). Jesus lifted up the cross as the standard for his disciples to live under, advising in Mathew 16:24, "Whoever wishes to come after me must deny himself, take up his cross, and follow me." And Jesus embodied such self-sacrificial service for God and others. St Paul describes Jesus' other-minded service in his letter to the Philippians 2:7-8, saving Jesus "emptied" himself, taking the form of a slave....humbling himself, and becoming obedient to death, even death on a cross.' They say that humility is the 'mother of all virtues'. Why? Because without humility, virtue is undone by selfaggrandizement; as the ego claims for itself all achievement, and the good is unraveled. So I love asking, 'Where did the young Jesus come up with this wise teaching? Or as His Nazareth neighbors asked, "Where did this man get such wisdom' (Matthew 13:54). How about the Mother of humility? Well let's ask her-Mary! She who gave birth and raised the child Jesus, calling herself in Luke 1:38 "the handmaid of the Lord', who sang God's praise because God had 'looked upon His handmaid's lowliness' and 'blessed it for all generations'. Mary then went on to describe how God humbles the exalted and exalts the humble, when she prayed in Luke 1:52 "He has thrown down the rulers from their thrones, but lifted up the lowly." It is no surprise to me that Mary, who was Christ's most faithful disciple, also embodied the meekness of humility.

So how can we embody humble service and modesty in our discipleship to Christ? Maybe an unlikely source, but I ran into a little Harvard Business Review article (Oct 2003), by Roderick Kramer that advised humility for CEO's of Wall Street companies. Kramer reviewed the work and life habits of successful CEO's that escaped the 'crash and burn' effect that brings down so many powerful leaders. He outlined five habits that prevented such falls from grace: 1) keep simple lives, 2) direct attention to our own weaknesses, 3) float trial balloons regularly, 4) sweat the small stuff, and 5) take time for reflection. Those five practices could easily be couched in some traditional religious terms and sound identical to what wise spiritual directors would call the 'devout life' of a faithful Christian.
