

# FATHER, SON AND HOLY SPIRIT

The early Church was faced with a dilemma how to explain the relationship that existed between the God of their ancestors, Jesus the Christ, and the Holy Spirit who came upon the apostles. Were there three Gods? The Jewish tradition held strictly to the notion of One God.

The name "Trinity" never appears in the New Testament. It wasn't until the year 200 AD that it was used, and not until 325 AD that it was defined by the Council of Nicea. Today, it is understood as "one God in three divine persons." This perfect community of love serves as a model and guide for us in our lives.

The artist, the poet, and the songwriter suggest images that help us appreciate this community and all that flows from it. We can never exhaust the reality of love, for it is always drawing us deeper in our relationships. Through the inspiration of the Holy Spirit, we are led to ponder the great mysteries of creation and redemption.

In this perfect community of love there are no boundaries; there is nothing that separates them. There are no "mine" or "yours." As the Gospel reminds us, "Everything that the Father has is mine."

If good, healthy, loved-filled relationships bring us joy, what joy there must be in God among the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit! This joy is so abundant that it overflows; God wants to share His joy with us.

It is into that loving union that we are invited through the gift of God's life that comes to us through grace. It is through our love for God and for one another, through prayer and through the celebrations of the sacraments that our union with God deepens.

Some day, it will all come together for us and make sense. For now, it remains a mystery that we will experience in a most wonderful way when the life of grace comes to full maturity in heavenly glory.

# The Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity The Sign of the Cross

Some call it "The Catholic Prayer". It is, certainly catholic, or universal, when we think of it as a prayer many people use whether they are Catholic or not; however, the Sign of the Cross was practiced long before St. Ignatius of Antioch first called the Church, "catholic".

The Sign of the Cross is much like a mini creed. We profess our belief in the Trinity and we give recognition that all is under God's creation and authority--in His Name.

The words to the Sign of the Cross come from Jesus in Matthew 28:19 as he taught

his apostles how to "make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the holy Spirit". A gesture of the cross, combined with this "baptismal formula", is said to have been used in the earliest baptisms; however, the gesture was not formalized until the 400's. At that time, the large Sign of the Cross went from the right to the left shoulder and the thumb and first two fingers touched to signify the Trinity. The ring and little fingers were pressed upon the palm to signify the divine and human natures of Jesus. Although many people continue that form today, especially in the Eastern Church, there are others, including the Western Church, who use an open hand to unite themselves with the five wounds of the suffering Christ upon the cross, with which we are marking ourselves. In the 1200's, Pope Innocent III accentuated this when he changed the movement of the gesture, the left shoulder to the right, to unite us with Jesus in the misery of the Passion and the crossing over to the glory of the Resurrection.

When we enter a church, we place our fingers in the blessed water of the holy water font and make the Sign of the Cross as a remembrance of how we first entered the Church through Baptism. The same is true during the Easter time when Father sprinkles the people with holy water and each person makes the Sign of the Cross in response. Even when the holy water doesn't literally touch the body, we are touched by God's claim on us. We accept both the comfort and the challenge of belonging to God.

In the Early Church, it was taught that it was a defense against the devil. If a person is living a Christ-like life, it is more difficult to take that person from temptation to sin.

The Sign of the Cross can also be a gesture of calm in times of fear or anxiousness, that God is with us through whatever we are facing.

Often, the Sign of the Cross is prayed before and after other prayers. Hardly bookends to the "important stuff in the middle", the Sign of the Cross is a powerful way of demonstrating in word and action, that we are in the presence of God as we pray.

#### I Pray:

In the name of the Father. the God who formed me before I was born, the Creator, my protector and my strength.

#### I Pray

In the name of the Son who became human, who shows me how to love. I feel the beat of my heart and remember Jesus the Son, whose sacred heart burns for me.

#### I Pray:

In the name of the Spirit who inspires me fills me with his fire, moves me, renews me and the face of the earth.

#### I Pray:

In the name of all that is holy and sacred, for it is in that holy space that I find God.

- 8. Unite with Christ in His Passion.

- 10. Mark yourself for Christ. Definitely, be a sheep. Just don't be sheepish.
