Situated on the boundary between two tribes, the Luo & Kuria, Petals has been called "the healing school" because it has been instrumental in bringing these two formerly warring tribes together. The area was once considered "dead" because of the discord and violence, but when the school opened, things began to change. Children from both tribes now attend Petals and representatives from both tribes serve on the school board and attend the Christian Science Society. Petals is widely credited with bringing harmony to the area, and it stands as a beacon of progress in the community.
