

We have begun the season of Advent. It is a season of celebration, preparation, and





What you need:

- Nonstick cooking spray
- 3 cups chocolate chips
- Microwave-safe bowl
- Spoon or spatula
- 2 Tbsp. shortening
- Baking tray lined with wax paper
- Red and green M&M's (or sprinkles)

What you do:


- 1. Lightly spray bowl and wax paper.
- 2. Microwave chocolate chips in bowl for oneminute intervals until chocolate is melted. (Stir after each minute.)
- 3. Stir in shortening. Heat in 10-second intervals, stirring until smooth.
- 4. Pour chocolate onto tray and firmly press in M&M's or sprinkles.
- 5. Refrigerate until firm. Remove bark and break into pieces.
