'We Shall Overcome'

The celebration of Juneteenth, the oldest known commemoration of the end of slavery in the United States, is 2 to 5 p.m. Friday, **June 19**, at El Paso Public Library Main Branch auditorium, 501 N. Oregon, Downtown, with works of art, poetry, music, dance, audience participation and light refreshments.

Juneteenth is an official state holiday in Texas and a day for all Americans to celebrate freedom from the institution of slavery.

Juneteenth is historically a celebration that commemorates the "Emancipation Proclamation" Signed by President Lincoln in 1863 that ended slavery in the United States.

eBird

Want to make sure your birding observations count towards more than a sense of satisfaction? Welcome to the future of birding! After your birding expeditions, you can enter your bird sightings online at ebird.org. Your observations are then added to others in the eBird database that scientists and citizens use to understand more about bird distributions.



eBird was developed by the Cornell Lab of Ornithology and National Audubon Society, and it enables anyone to enter bird sightings from anywhere in North America and explore the results. eBird is a portal through which any birdwatcher can enter the birds they have observed into the eBird database.

Every time you notice a bird, you are holding a piece of a puzzle. By sharing your sighting with others through eBird, you'll make it possible to complete the picture we need to better understand and protect birds well into the future.

AT FEATHER LAKE

A storm on May 12 provided another one-day shot of water to a small area at the inlet to the Feather Lake basin. At least that area is looking green and supporting some new coyote-willow growth.

For most of the basin, the effects of prolonged drought are stark and obvious. One small bright spot: **Gambel's Quail** and **Greater Roadrunners** have become more common in recent years with the basin dry most of the time.

Our next workday at Feather Lake takes place **Sat., June 6** starting at **8 a.m.** Guess what? The removal of trash washed into the basin with storm water continues. Can we get the remaining mattresses out before summer rains arrive?

Feather Lake is located at 9500 North Loop at Bordeaux in El Paso, 0.3 miles west of Americas Ave.

The park's wetland cells are attracting a nice mix of water birds. For up-to-date information on birds and water conditions, check www.riobosque.org. Upcoming free walking tours:



Feather Lake Water Depth



Saturday, June 6, 2015 Rattlesnake Springs

Rattlesnake Springs, part of Carlsbad Caverns National Park, is an Important Bird Area (IBA) and outstanding stopover site for land birds.



We'll be looking for the **Northern Cardinal**, **Summer Tanager**, **Bullock's Orioles**, **Orchard Orioles** and, of course, **Vermilion Flycatchers**.

We need to leave early because of the heat and it's a long drive, so we'll meet at 6:00 a.m. in front of Evergreen Cemetery, 12400 E. Montana, 1/4 mile east of Loop 375.

Meet at Keystone Heritage Park at 6:30 p.m. at 4200 Doniphan Drive. Open to the public.


