- <u>Treasurer's Report</u> accepted.
- <u>Hotline</u> The Hotline Committee has developed a website for volunteers to access current information rather than having to search through emails. All slots are covered; requesting folks to sign up as alternates to fill in for vacations.
- Schedules Mark is keeping newspaper current; brought remainder of schedules from Lit Locker.
- <u>Info Exchange</u> Hui 'Ohana is hosting Fourth of July celebration at Lydgate large pavilion; passed out handbills. Forgot to mention that this meeting needs support: "Experience, Strength & Hope" in Kapa'a Fridays at 10am.
- <u>Literature</u> Mark distributed inventory report; more books on order; large print being requested.
- <u>AA Events</u> One member requested that AA consider "going green" and not use Styrofoam, not waste paper. Labor Day – IGRs approved \$50 towards Labor Day event at Salt Pond; Jana will coordinate.

- Corrections: Member asked why it seems that AA is not welcome in KCCC; will pursue.

Olde Business:

• <u>AA Website</u> – Chair polled IGRs; nobody opposed to a website. Distributed information on website development to date; asked that Groups and individuals consider how a website could best serve Kaua'i AA. Asked in particular to discuss guidelines for what events & flyers to approve for posting & linking on the website. One IGR suggested using pictures or symbols to links, for folks with reading limitations. New Business:

- <u>KCFB Fair</u> Chair asked Groups to discuss support of Farm Bureau Fair. Opinions expressed were: Agin: It violates Tradition Eleven two ways: 1 Anonymity at the level of press, radio & films; and 2 that it is promotion rather than attraction. Another stated that it costs a lot of money. Fer: Common practice elsewhere; Maui AA has participated with informational booth at their County Fair for over 30 years; cost has gone down \$100 from last year; Al-Anon again willing to split cost of booth; Passersby do not know if booth staffers are AA or Al-Anon; community leaders and church groups have expressed encouragement & gratitude to booth staffers for AA's and Al-Anon's service to the community.
