The Rev. Adolf M. Bickel, 86, of Napoleon, Ohio, passed away Sunday morning, February 25, 2007, at the Fulton Manor, Wauseon, Ohio. He was born July 14, 1920 in Birch Run to the late Rev. During his last year of life, he resided at Country View Haven Nursing Home, rural Napoleon, Ohio, where he served as chaplain. He was a founding member of the German Lutheran Heritage Association. He held several Ohio District Church offices and also authored two books. "The Emigrant" and "Our Founding Father." He is survived by three sons.
