

Reel Theology Returns September 21!


Join the fun on September 21 when we gather to watch and discuss the film *Love*, *Simon*.

This film is a romantic comedy-drama centering on Simon Spier, a closeted gay high schooler who is forced to balance his friends, his family, and the blackmailer threatening to out him to the entire school, while simultaneously attempting to discover the identity of the anonymous classmate with whom he has fallen in love online. It is the perfect film to begin our

program year as we continue our journey to become an official ONA congregation! Critics praised the film for its "big heart, diverse and talented cast, and revolutionary normalcy", describing it as "tender, sweet, and affecting" and a "hugely charming crowd-pleaser" that is "funny, warm-hearted and life-affirming." All ages are invited to join us, but this film is rated PG13. We will have a potluck from 5:00-5:30 p.m. We will begin the movie at 5:30 and following the film, we will have our discussion. Read the Bible - the WHOLE Bible?? Yes! Community Bible Experience Begins this Fall!

This year we will read the Bible, the whole thing, starting with Genesis and moving all the way through to Revelation. Learning happens best in community, over time, and all are welcome to be

part of this program. The Community Bible Experience is a new way to talk about the Bible: less like a Bible study and more like a book club. This church-wide program welcomes everyone no matter how much (or little) of the Bible we have already read. We will meet monthly to discuss what we have read.

This program breaks the scriptures into four books and the reading plan works out to reading 12-15 pages a day, 5 days a week for 8 weeks (per book). The format of each of the books provides a more accessible text. Rather than the traditional format of columns, chapter, verses, and footnotes, the text is simply written in book form. This format is a fresh yet ancient presentation of Scripture. It strips away centuries of added formatting so we can read and enjoy just the Bible text.

There will be a cost for materials, but financial assistance is available. The books range in price from \$7.00-13.00 (hardcover) or \$10.00 for the e-books.

Please plan to come to an information meeting about this program following worship on September 8 or September 15. At this time you can get more information, see samples of the materials, register, and get your questions answered (hopefully!!).

From the Council President

On the 4th of August our congregation held a special congregational meeting. The agenda contained only two items:

- 1. The presentation of the amended version of Hope UCC's Constitution and Bylaws for discussion and approval. First, a list of amendments that were sent to the Council in July was presented to the congregation. This list was discussed and a few modifications were made; the list was approved by a unanimous vote of those present. Then the complete and amended version of the current Constitution and Bylaws was presented to the congregation. I am happy to report that the new Constitution and Bylaws for Hope UCC were unanimously approved! These new documents become effective on the first of January, 2020!
 - A copy of the new constitution and bylaws was e-mailed out with the September newsletter and calendar. If you didn't receive a copy by e-mail but would like to obtain a copy please contact Bob Tallitsch or the church office, and one will be provided for you.
- 2. At the Church Council's goal setting in January it was stated that our congregation would like the financial procedures to be more transparent. As a result of that request the status of our congregation's finances was presented to the congregation and discussed. This type of meeting will become an annual event in late July/early August. If you would like a copy of the financial report that was discussed please contact Bob Tallitsch and one will be provided for you.

On behalf of your Church Council and Trustees I would like to thank everyone that participated in the proofreading of the numerous drafts of the constitution and bylaws, as well as thank all of those that participated in the special congregational meeting. In addition, a HUGE thank-you goes out to all members and friends of Hope UCC for participating in the life of our congregation!

Faith Exploration News

Building on the success of our rotational Sunday school curriculum used last year, Faith Exploration is working hard for 2019-2020! The beauty of the curriculum is that it is creatively written and well-prepared to be teacher friendly requiring very little preparation. Faith Exploration hopes that these FAQ's will help inspire you to step up and help teach our kids!

What does rotational curriculum mean?

Rotational curriculum means that each month of lessons is based on one theme or Bible story. During the month, students rotate into the different areas such as cooking, science, art, games, music, or drama using various approaches to teach the lesson.

How are students divided into groups?

Students come to each area by age groupings.

Lower elementary (Pre-Kindergarten, kindergarten, first grade)

Upper elementary (Grades 2, 3, 4 and 5)

What is involved in teacher preparation?

You will receive the complete curriculum packet for just your area and you read and prepare the lesson for "lower" and "upper." You will know who is coming to you on a given Sunday and you proceed with the lesson.

May I just teach one Sunday?

Yes and no. We need **non-bell choir** volunteers for every 3rd Sunday of the month.

On that Sunday, all ages will participate together in pre-planned lessons.

What about the 1st, 2nd, and 4th Sundays?

For consistency with the children and how you best get to know one another, it is best to volunteer to do a "month" of Sundays.

How do I volunteer?

Pam has sign up sheets in the church office. You can also speak to any Faith Exploration Ministry member or Pastor Santina.

Very likely someone in your childhood took the time to nurture you. Our children need the same. This is place where no one ages out and the benefits to both you and our kids are immense.

From Hope UCC's President

At our last Council meeting we decided that it was time for our Nominating Ministry to start its work and find qualified individuals who are willing to serve Hope UCC on its various Ministries. But...we often get a question that contains one or more of the following: "What does the Ministry do?" "How long do I serve?" "Can I get re-elected?" So...at the suggestion of Pastor Santina, here is a listing of Hope UCC's ministries and the answers to any and all questions you might have. If, after reading the information below, you feel that you have the skills and desire to serve on any of Hope UCC's ministries please contact me by phone (764-8507) or e-mail roberttallitsch@augustana.edu

It takes a lot of people to do God's work, but the more that chip in, the easier the tasks. Hope UCC has experienced a considerable growth in enthusiasm and participation, and your willingness to serve on any of the Ministries outlined below will only help to make that enthusiasm grow. And remember, you can also volunteer to step in and help with any ministries and activities, even if you're not officially serving on a ministry. Extra help is always happily accepted. So, I would ask you to look inward and determine what strengths and interests you have, and then see how they dovetail with the needs of Hope UCC and volunteer to serve on one of the Ministries outlined below.

Church Council: The Church Council sets the policies of the church and coordinates the activities of the congregation. We have three "At Large" members that serve for one-year terms, and they may serve for no more than three consecutive terms. We have three positions to fill on the Church Council.

Trustees: The Trustees are the legal representatives of Hope UCC, as determined by the laws of The State of Illinois. They are responsible for the finances of the church and for maintenance of the building and grounds of the church. The trustees will be looking for at least one new member, so if you have an interest in finance or are good with understanding the needs for the maintenance of the building and grounds of the church then Trustees is for you! We would be excited if you would volunteer for a three-year term.

Faith Exploration and Education: Simply put, Faith Exploration is responsible for all of the educational programs of the church: adult, youth, and children's. Although, as a member of this Ministry you would not be required to teach in Sunday school, it would be an added treat and an additional way to serve Hope UCC and this Ministry. This Ministry will be looking for at least one new member to serve a three-year term.

Mission and Outreach: This is the newest Ministry for Hope UCC. As stated in the constitution, this Ministry is responsible for promoting interest and participation in the ministries of the Church and shall work with the pastor and the Faith Exploration and Education Ministry. The Ministry shall work to promote the Church's rendering of loving service to all people and strive for justice and peace. This work shall be in conjunction with community and welfare agencies and the Faith Exploration and Education Ministry. This Ministry will need at least three new members to serve either one-, two- or three-year terms.

Worship and Music: This Ministry works with Pastor Santina as she evaluates worship format and plans worship services outside the normal worship services. This Ministry is also responsible for arranging the for preparation of Communion, arranging for greeters, liturgists, ushers, communion servers etc. This Ministry will be looking for at least one new member who would be willing to serve for three years. Again, I would ask you to look inwardly and determine what strengths and interests you have, and then see how they dovetail with the needs of Hope UCC and volunteer to serve on one of the Ministries outlined below.
