



History of the American Flag

Illuminating American History Through the American Flag Republic of Indian Stream, 1832-1835 Eleventh in a Series By Thomas Palchak





The history of real settlement at Indian Stream begins in 1796. During that year Chief Philip, of the St. Francis tribe, gave to David Gibbs, Nathaniel Wales, and Moody Bedel a deed to large tracts of land which included Indian Stream. The deed was executed on June 30. * In 1832, the inhabitants proclaimed their settlement the Indian Stream Republic. The new country immediately got to work doing all the things that countries are supposed to do. It enacted laws, establishing a constitution, a bicameral legislature, and courts. It printed its own postage stamps and formed an armed militia of 41 men. Indian Stream had de facto control over its claimed territory and was self-governing with a desire for full independence and eventual statehood.

The 1783 Treaty of Paris, which settled hostilities between the brand-new United States and Great Britain, left the U.S.-Canada boundary line a little open to interpretation. The U.S. and Britain disagreed about which body of water counted, and as a result, a 280-square-mile patch of land between two tributaries was subject to taxation by both countries.

As squabbling increased among the United States and Canadian governments, New Hampshire legislators, and two companies claiming land rights, the settlers decided to take matters into their own hands.

Things came to a head when a band of Streamers invaded Canada to liberate one of their countrymen from custody. This particular Streamer had been arrested by a British sheriff because of an unpaid hardware store debt. The invading posse shot up the judge's house where their compatriot was held. This caused an international incident – even if the idea of going to war over a case of shoplifting seems a bit over the top. In 1835 "war broke out" when a pro-Canadian resident was arrested in the Republic, some say in retaliation. These events escalated into several more incidents, until the New Hampshire governor ordered the state militia to occupy the Indian Stream Republic. In January 1838 the British gave up their claim. The following May, the local citizens accepted New Hampshire 's authority. It was incorporated as the township of Pittsburg by the New Hampshire legislature in the November 1840 session.

* This marked the only time in the history of the United States when a Native American tribe deeded property to the United States without a treaty.

Constitution Day Democracy Roundtables

Legion members are invited to the Constitution Day Democracy Roundtables, on Saturday, Sept. 23 from 11 am to 1:30 pm., on the American Legion patio. The public event is organized by Constitution Day Centre Inc., a local nonprofit promoting the celebration of the U.S. Constitution and civil conversations among people of all beliefs.

This year's theme is Making Our Voices Heard. Led by moderators, groups of 8 people will share their viewpoints on 3 questions: Does the Electoral College protect our democracy? Do legislators pick their voters? Whose voices are heard -- voters or donors? Each group will present highlights of their discussions at the end of the event. The goal is to listen to each other, seek common ground, and learn what we all share in common. We hope to publish an essay about everyone's insights in the local media and share with local leaders.

After the roundtable, there will be a presentation of the Madison Award for Civility in the Community. This award celebrates community leadership and civility.
