The Reverend's Ruminations - December 2023

Advent (the four Sundays leading to the celebration of Christmas) begins almost logically this year on December 3rd. You may find yourself saying, "But why do you always talk about Advent, pastor? We all know Christmas is coming, so let's get on with it!?" Sure, that might be easier; but like a child waiting to open presents, the anticipation of Advent is part of what makes it important to our understanding of the seasons of the church year.

It's hard to pin down exactly when Advent became an official season in the calendar of the Western Christian church, but it has been with us since at least the Middle Ages. To borrow from an article about Advent and its traditions on Vox.com, "...the word Advent comes from the Latin word for "arrival" — adventus — which means [even] non-Christians can celebrate it simply as a fun countdown to Christmas." But to simplify it that much risks cheapening our Christian understanding of the observance.

You may have noticed that I often open our worship services by mentioning where we are in the church calendar (Second Sunday in Lent, Twenty-Third Sunday after Pentecost, Reign of Christ Sunday, etc.), and that is because we progress through various seasons as a means of keeping in touch with the important events that shape our faith. To borrow again from Vox.com:

"The easiest way to understand the Christian church's calendar is as a sort of live immersive theater, designed by tradition to reenact the life of Jesus every year from Christmas (birth) to Easter (resurrection), with readings in traditional churches that revisit stories from the gospels each year during that time. Advent... is the part of the calendar that's all about anticipation. In Christian teaching, there are two events being anticipated. Part of the observance of Advent... is reenacting the centuries of anticipation of the birth of Jesus as written about by prophets like Isaiah in the Old Testament.

But Christian theology also contains a belief that at the end of days, Jesus will return to set things right in the world, erasing death and suffering — a concept usually called the Second Coming. So in addition to being about the anticipation of Jesus's birth (the first coming), Advent is also set aside as a time of quietness and austerity, meant to keep Christians from glossing over the brokenness of the world and to encourage them to anticipate the Second Coming."

When we realize that Advent is not just an over-hyped invitation to get all our shopping done for yet another high-pressure "season of getting" (er, giving), it can take on a much calmer, more comforting note of focus — on our faith and the true gift of Jesus our Savior, as well as a healthy anticipation of Christ's eventual triumphant return. I encourage you to take time away from the busyness of your December to read from the Old Testament prophecies and the Gospel accounts of the Advent season:

First Sunday (Dec. 3) Isaiah 64:1–9 Mark 13:24–37
Second Sunday (Dec. 10) Isaiah 40:1–11 Mark 1:1–8
Third Sunday (Dec. 17) Isaiah 61:1–4, 8–11 John 1:6–8, 19–28
Fourth Sunday (Dec. 24) 2nd Samuel 7:1–11 Luke 1:26–38

"Take note that since the Sundays of Advent precede the observation of Christmas Day, we WILL be having a worship service on the morning of Christmas Eve in addition to our traditional Candlelight Christmas Eve service that evening. I encourage you not to skip the morning service under the guise of "we'll be there later anyway," as each worship experience will have a different focus. Think of it as a rare opportunity to bring our Advent anticipation to a peak within hours of the fulfilling celebration of Christ's birth. What a party!

2024 is just around the corner, and I look forward to its many opportunities to continue serving our great God together. Alleluia, and Happy New (Church) Year!

Hy-Vee & Fareway Report as of 19 November 2023

During the last four weeks, \$16,938.16 (8.47%) worth of Hy-Vee slips were received. After 47 weeks, Hy-Vee is at \$190,845.42 (95.42%) toward the 16th goal which is now \$200,000.

During the same time, \$4,017.22 (2.68%) worth of Fareway slips were received. After 29 weeks, Fareway is at \$36,580.27 (24.39%) toward our 5^{th} \$150,000 goal.

This program started the first of March 2011, so any slips from then until now can be used. Any Fairmont Fareway and Hy-Vee food store register slip can be used. Even slips from Hy-Vee Fast & Fresh (Gas), Coffee Shop, Food Service, and Pharmacy help us toward the goal. Delivery slips/ sheets can also be used. Thanks to all who bring/mail the slips to the Church, or mailing them or dropping them off at my house.



Taco-Filled Pasta Shells

A favorite recipe of the Anderson family & the Hainy family

Total Time

Prep: 20 min. + chilling Bake: 45 min.

Makes

2 casseroles (6 servings each)

Ingredients

- 2 pounds ground beef (other similar recipes add 1 cup chopped onion)
- 2 envelopes taco seasoning
- 1-1/2 cups water
- 1 package (8 ounces) cream cheese, cubed
- 24 uncooked jumbo pasta shells
- 1/4 cup butter, melted
- additional ingredients (for each casserole):
- 1 cup salsa
- 1 cup taco sauce (other similar recipes substitute enchilada sauce)
- 1 cup shredded cheddar cheese
- 1 cup shredded Monterey Jack or mozzarella cheese
- 1-1/2 cups crushed tortilla chips
- 1 cup sour cream
- 3 green onions, chopped



Directions

- 1. In a Dutch oven, cook beef (& chopped onions) over medium heat until no longer pink; drain. Stir in taco seasoning and water. Bring to a boil. Reduce heat; simmer, uncovered, for 5 minutes. Stir in cream cheese until melted. Transfer to a bowl; cool. Chill for 1 hour.
- 2. Cook pasta according to package directions; drain. Gently toss with butter. Fill each shell with about 3 tablespoons of meat mixture. Place 12 filled shells in a greased freezer container. Cover and freeze for up to 3 months.
- 3. To prepare remaining 12 stuffed shells, spoon 1 cup salsa into a greased 9-in. square baking dish. Top with stuffed shells and 1 cup taco sauce. Cover and bake at 350° for 30 minutes. Uncover; sprinkle with 1 cup of each cheese and 1-1/2 cups chips. Bake 15 minutes longer or until heated through. Serve with sour cream and onions.

*To use frozen shells, thaw in the refrigerator for 24 hours (shells will be partially frozen). Remove from dish. Spoon 1 cup salsa into a greased 9-in. square baking dish; top with shells and 1 cup taco sauce. Cover and bake at 350° for 40 minutes. Uncover. Sprinkle with 1 cup of each cheese and 1-1/2 cups chips. Bake 15 minutes longer or until heated through. Serve with sour cream and onions.
