

From the President's Desk:

Hello, and finally welcome to summer! As such, there is increased pressure on the ranges, and we are seeing the usual annual actions of the uninformed. So here are a few reminders:

All projectiles MUST impact a berm. Please be aware of your target placement. Targets must be of an appropriate height, that bullets do not impact the ground, or the top 1/3 of the berm. No

"rolling on the ground" targets at all. Rounds impacting the ground ricochet in unpredictable directions and cause damage to the range. Rounds impacting near the top of the berms may penetrate it.

The new 50 and 75-yard berm-lets on the right side of the rifle range can only be engaged from the rightmost benches, or the stoned area under the rifle pavilion. Shooting at these berm-lets from the left side benches creates dangerous angles, and possibilities of misses going over the rifle range side berm. Continued miss-use of these berm-lets will result in their removal.

When shooting at steel targets, please be no closer that 13 yards for pistol calibers, and 50 yards for all rifle calibers. Shooting at closer distances greatly increases the possibility of injury from bullet jacket shrapnel.

When going down range to change targets, please always turn on the lights and take the flag. Wear something very bright. Visibility is the key.

As per the club Constitution (Article IX, B), "No activities utilizing the grounds of the York Chapter shall be conducted for private gains without prior approval of the board", there are liability, legal and use management issues involved here. You can share range time or dog running time with friends all day long, but as soon as money changes hands, it is a violation. When caught, this will incur action from the board. Please, if you want to teach a class for profit, petition the board, they are nicer than they look.

Please display your membership card when using the grounds. It can be on your person or your gear. As a reminder, the ranges are under constant video surveillance.

On another note: the board last month passed a new rule, banning smoking from the interior of all buildings on the club grounds. Signage will be appearing shortly.



Our local shooters were able to compete with some of the best shooters from at least 10 surrounding states and some of them did guite well. taken lesser competitors out of the game. Some parts of the match required the use of two guns and others required mastery of all three. Targets ranged from point blank to almost 200 yards. 17th Century Re-Enactment

To include cannon-fire demonstration

On Sunday, Sept. 9th, the Isaak Walton League of York will host 17th Century re-enactors, the Twisted Knot Company of Pike and Shotte. As part of their demonstration the company will fire their cannon, a type used



by Maryland colonists against the Susquehannock Indians and foreign colonial forces.

The Company portrays soldiers who used "pike and shot" tactics during the reign of Queen Elizabeth I, the early American Colonial period, and the English Civil Wars. They will be appearing at the Pennsylvania Renaissance Faire throughout October and asked the IWL for space to rehearse after their summer hiatus. Their demonstration will include matchlock muskets, pikes (two-handed spears) and classical sword fighting technique.

The demonstrations will be conducted in authentic period dress, including armor. The event will begin around 1PM and last until 4PM. Visitors will be welcome to ask questions, handle the weaponry, and interact with the company. The event is open to the public.
