Twenty years ago, I drove a cab for a living. When I arrived at 2:30 a.m., the building was dark except for a single light in a ground floor window. Many drivers would just honk, wait a minute, then drive away.

Unless a situation smelled of danger, I always went to the door. This passenger might be someone who needs my assistance. So I walked to the door and knocked. "Just a minute", answered a frail, elderly voice. I could hear something being dragged across the floor.

After a long pause, the door opened. A small woman in her 80s stood before me, wearing a dress and a pillbox hat with a veil pinned on it, like somebody out of a 1940s movie. By her side was a small suitcase. The apartment looked as if no one had lived in it for years. All the furniture was covered with sheets. There were no clocks on the walls, no knickknacks or utensils on the counters. In the corner was a cardboard box filled with photos and glassware.

"Would you carry my bag out to the car?" she said. I took the suitcase to the cab then returned to assist the woman. She took my arm, walking slowly to the curb. She kept thanking me for my kindness. "It's nothing", I told her. "I just try to treat my passengers the way I would want my mother treated."

When we got in the cab, she gave me an address then asked, "Could you drive through downtown?" "It's not the shortest way," I answered quickly. "Oh, I don't mind," she said. "I'm in no hurry, I'm on my way to hospice". I looked in the rearview mirror. "I don't have any family," she continued. "The doctor says I don't have very long." I quietly reached over and shut off the meter.



For the next two hours, we drove through the city. She showed me the building where she had worked as an elevator operator. We drove through the neighborhood where she and her husband had lived as newlyweds. We stopped at a furniture warehouse that once was a ballroom where she had gone dancing as a girl. Sometimes she'd ask me to slow in front of a building or corner and would sit staring into the darkness.

As the first hint of sun, she suddenly said, "Let's go now." We drove in silence to the address. Two orderlies came out to the cab as soon as we pulled up. They must have been expecting her. I opened the trunk and took the small suitcase to the door. "How much do I owe you?" she asked, reaching into her purse. "Nothing," I said. "You have to make a living," she answered. "There are other passengers," I responded. Almost without thinking, I bent down and gave her a hug. She held onto me tightly. "You gave an old woman a little moment of joy," she said. "Thank you." I squeezed her hand.

I didn't pick up any more passengers that shift. I drove aimlessly. What if that woman had gotten an angry driver or one who was impatient to end his shift? What if I had refused to take the run or had honked once and then driven away?

We're conditioned to think that our lives revolve around great moments. But great moments often catch us unaware-beautifully wrapped in what others may consider a small one.



God's Finger Painting


The colors splash about, vibrant shades of orange-red mingled with shiny slivers of a brilliant golden thread.


