The Wyoming State Convention and Rendezvous has become so large that no other hotel in Casper can accommodate us with such a large trader floor this is great.

Something unknown to the people in Washington, DC. is the Wyoming State Muzzleloaders Association is operating in the black! This is due in a large part to the changes we have made the past few years with e-mailing the newsletter, the web site and changes to mailing of the hard copies of the newsletter. I made it over to the 6th annual John Colter Frozen Toes Shoot. There was a little breakdown in communication for the John Colter shoot; however Ned Dun, with help from other people and the Big Horn Basin Muzzleloaders held a great one day shoot at the little town of Meeteetee. The people in attendance spoke loud and clear that they want this shoot to continue in the future. That is great, now we need to get a few more people involved.

LZ, Ned and a few others want to try a 2nd smoothbore trap and skeet shoot. We are looking at a more central area. This is currently planned for April 27 and 28th, 2013 at the Worland gun club. Look for the flier in the newsletter or on-line. This is an unfunded shoot, so it will be blanket shoot. We will have to pay for the birds. The Worland gun club has new trap throwers. If you want try something new and a real challenge try shooting trap and skeet with a shot gun or smooth bore muzzleloader. If you do not have a shot gun or smoothbore show up as we will have plenty for people to use. This is also a great warm-up for the Ed Green Memorial Quail shoot and smoothbore matches. LZ is planning on putting some articles in the newsletter about shot gun shooting, including the rules of the game.

WSMLA Conventional General Meeting, Casper Wyoming Minutes

January 26th, 2013

Call to Order: The meeting was called to order by President Bill Morrison who welcomed everyone to the meeting. Roll call was done and a quorum was established. Gary Millhouse let the pledge of Allegiance. Board members present were: Bill Morrison, Willie Felton, Melissa Connelly, Trish Miller, Ed Kern, Tony Larvie, Gary Milhouse, Mike Lewis, Ernie Evans, Angie Lehto.

Minutes: Minutes from the previous meeting have been posted. A motion was made to approve the minutes and the motion passed.

Election: Terms ending this year are Bill, Paula, Ginger and Willie. Nominations were made Gary and seconded by Mike J. to support Bill, Frank, Willie and Paula. Motion passed.

Awards: Awards and Traveling Trophy winners were presented by Rooster. It was mentioned that there were very few junior and sub junior participants.

Committee Reports:

Convention: There were new vendors. Convention appears to be successful

Auction: Items were still being donated. Junior Molina will do the Auction

Entertainment: No report. Swing Sounds were ready to go.

Photo Contest: up and ready for voting

Newsletter: AMBI working well. There was a cost savings using AMBI. Articles and information is requested.

Hat and T-shirts: nor report

Traveling Trophy: no report

Historian: No report

Website: the website has crashed and needs rebuilt. Bill is working on the issues.

Old business and New business: Angie presented changes proposed for the Bylaws. Changes included clarification of language, updates to previous motions, dues, and membership. A draft was available online and printed in the newsletter prior to the January meeting for review. The only major change was an added section regarding amendment changes must be presented 60 days prior to the vote. All procedures will be listed in a second document. There was a motion to remove Sec 4, Item 6. Discussion suggested that participants in state sanction shoots should be members. Motion passed. There was a motion to accept the amended Bylaws and the motion passed.

The board approved \$2,500 to be available as a Grant to state clubs. Funds can be used for targets, insurance, etc. Proposals need to be in writing and given to a board member at or before the Memorial Day meeting. An application announcement and a cap for the funds will be posted. Discussion also included the idea that applicants must be registered clubs.

There was a discussion on having members of the WSMLA participate in the WGF dept. Heritage Expo each fall. Several members offered to check into this event.

DCML and the Big Horn Basin offered to host the next summer State Shoot. A vote supported the DCML. The shoot will be held on Father's Day weekend in June.

The 6th Annual John Colter Shoot Results

The 6th Annual John Colter shoot was held at Meeteetse, Wyoming on 02/23/2013. Turn out for the John Colter shoot was down a little due to some communication problems. There were 14 shooters and a few spectators that showed up to brave the elements on a fine Wyoming Winter Day. Weather was a bit chilly around 25-30 degrees; wind was light east to west. Yes, east to west.

The Meeteetse gun club had plowed the shooting range including the steps. It was still slick, however at least we were not fighting the snow pack. They also provided new shooting backboards. A big thank you goes out the town of Meeteetse. They also announced that they have received a grant from the NRA for a new vaulted toilet next year.

We had shooters from Casper, Riverton, Lander, Cody, Shell, Worland and Billings, MT. A few shooters came a long way to join in with the fun.

We changed around the paper targets this year. Bottles at 25 yards 7 shots, Buffalo at 100 yards, 8 shots. Gong where shot at 40, 65, 100 and 125 yards. Ned, being only one half evil, swapped around the 65 and 40 yards gongs. The 65 yards swingers were really tough to hit with the little bit of wind we had. Surprisingly I nailed the 125 yards gong twice. I think that is a first for me.

Ned split the group in half, part shot gongs and part shot paper. It moved along fairly fast breaking things up into the two groups.

After the shoot we gathered at the Elk Horn Bar for a special roast beef dinner and fixings. Ned Dunn gathered up some cash for the winners along with donations from Bryan Youngberg and the Elk Horn Bar. There were prizes for the top 7 shooters, plus the entry fee of a dozen cookies for all of the shooters.

The John Colter shoot is a great one day shoot due to the hard work of Ned Dunn. Ned donated the steel gong targets. The Big Horn Basin Muzzleloaders donated the paper targets. What a fine day to enjoy Northwest Wyoming. The snow and wind held off till after the meal.



Minutes: The minutes from the previous meeting was read, motion to accept was made and minutes were passed.

Treasurer Report: Mike Lewis gave a treasurer's report that shows that the State Association is financially solvent. Income was made from T-shirt sales, booths, meals, and auction. A total of \$4658 was made at convention. We sold out of the hats but had a few T-shirts left. There was a discussion on colors and designs. Any ideas were requested.
