

Parish Membership: Every family and single adult to be considered active members of St. Bartholomew's Parish must be properly registered in the parish, receiving and regularly using the parish weekly donation envelopes. Only in this way can the parish issue documents attesting to parish membership and Catholic practice, e.g. a letter to be a Godparent or Sponsor. New parishioners are requested to visit the parish office.

Sick & Shut-ins: The priests are available to administer the Sacraments to those who are unable to come to Church. The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is part of the healing ministry of the Church, and should be received early in an illness or before a serious operation.

Baptisms: Please call the parish office to make arrangements.

Marriages: In order to provide sufficient time for the Marriage Preparation Course, please call the parish office and ask to speak with the pastor at least six months in advance of the wedding.

LOVE ONE ANOTHER AS I HAVE LOVED YOU

If you trace the route that Paul and Barnabas took on the first of Paul's great missionary journeys, you will




something unusual. see Once they reached Derbe ("that city" in the first line of today's first reading), they returned exactly the way they came before sailing back

across the Mediterranean. With a whole world to convert, why would they pass right back through the same towns they'd already visited? The answer is found elsewhere in the first reading: they "exhorted them to persevere in the faith" (Acts 14:22). It is one thing to make a commitment, it is something else to sustain that commitment. Paul and Barnabas realized that for the newly baptized Christians to become true disciples, they had to persevere in the face of hardship. We are called to persevere as well.

Jesus tells His disciples that they will be recognized by the love that they have for one another. This applies no less to us today. Can we be recognized by the love we have for each other? Or do we fail to act in a "Christian" way to our brothers and sisters?

To love one another on Jesus' terms entails more than

acting kindly and empathetically. This is a start, but Jesus demands more. Note the entire sentence "As I



challenged to act selflessly, to put others ahead of ourselves, even when it comes to our own lives. This is a challenge Jesus gives His followers.
