## Stash Buster: A CHRISTMAS TREE CHAIN

- 1. Cut a strip  $1\frac{1}{4}$  by 6 inches.
- 2. Wrong side up, fold the strip in thirds, one long side over the other. Pin.
- 3. Hide the knot inside and start hand-stitching through the tube, down the middle from A toward B.
- 4. When you stitch to about half inch of end B, stop and stick the needle through to the tidy side.
- 5. Fold the unstitched B end to the messy side.


WARNING: If this is not your first loop, read 9 first.

- 6. Make a circle, putting the B end over the A end, and stick the needle through the A end, about where the stitching started.
- 7. Stitch through and around the overlap to secure the circle. (Over stitch or straight stitch or whatever.)
- 8. Make a knot. Hide the end of the thread and snip. This loop is done.
- 9. For the next loop Repeat, but as you do step 6, hook one end through Loop 1 before finishing the circle. Etc.

A chain of 10 loops is about 18 inches long. It took about 3 days to make a 2-yard chain by hand.

Of course, you can adjust to your style. Strips can be wider, longer, shorter. You can pink the edges. You can stitch with a machine. You can mix the colours or have it all match. Feel free to be free.

# Merry Cherry Cheesecake Squares

#### Provided by Kathryn Paddock

Recip

### **Ingredients:**

#### <u>Crust:</u>

1/3 cup cold butter1/3 cup firmly packed brown sugar1 cup flour

#### Filling:

8 oz cream cheese, softened

- $\frac{1}{4}$  cup sugar
- 1 beaten egg
- 1 Tbsp lemon juice
- $\frac{1}{4}$  cup chopped glazed red cherries, cut into guarters

 $\frac{1}{4}$  cup chopped glazed green cherries, cut into quarters

### Directions:

1. Preheat oven to 350 F.

#### <u>Crust:</u>

- 2. Mix ingredients together well with pastry blender until crumbly. Reserve  $\frac{1}{2}$  cup of crumbs for the top.
- 3. Press remainder into an 8" x 8" pan.
- 4. Bake at 350F for 10-12 minutes.

#### Filling:

- 5. Beat all ingredients (except cherries) with a mixer until smooth.
- 6. Stir in cherries.
- 7. Spread filling over baked crust.
- 8. Sprinkle with reserved crumbs.
- 9. Bake 18 20 minutes @ 350F.
