



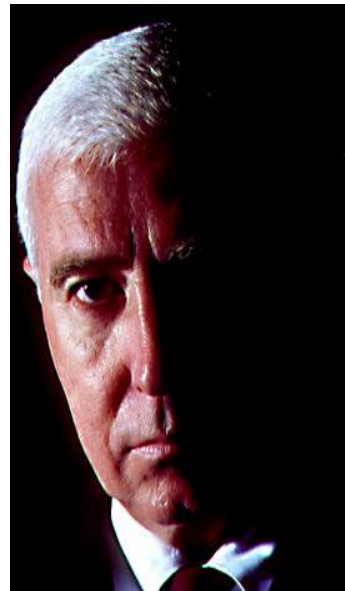

FREDERICK W. RUSTMANN, JR.

Fred W Rustmann is a core member of OPSEC and has appeared in OPEC's viral video *Dishonorable Disclosures*.

Mr. Rustmann entered the private consulting field immediately upon retirement from the Central Intelligence Agency. Shortly thereafter, recognizing the need for U.S. corporations to collect business intelligence and to protect their proprietary information, Mr. Rustmann founded CTC International Group, Inc. The company is a recognized industry leader and has enjoyed more than twenty years of uninterrupted success.

As chairman of CTC, Mr. Rustmann has written numerous articles on business intelligence, counterintelligence and espionage, and has been quoted in many national and international publications including Time Magazine, USA Today, New York Times, Baltimore Sun, New York Daily News and the Miami Herald. He has also been interviewed by CNN, Reuters, FNN and other news agencies regarding current events and other intelligence and security related subjects. He is the author of *CIA, Inc.: Espionage and the Craft of Business Intelligence*, which was published by Brassey's in 2002, and has recently (2013) published his first novel, *The Case Officer*.



Mr. Rustmann entered the CIA as a Career Trainee and spent the next 24 years in the Clandestine Service (Directorate of Operations) working as a case officer. During most of this time (17 years) he was assigned abroad to posts in eight countries in Asia, Europe, and Africa during the Cold War. In two of these foreign assignments he was the senior CIA officer (chief of station) in country. A fluent French speaker, he holds a B.A. in Sociology from Oklahoma State University and served in the U.S. Marine Corps. Mr. Rustmann retired from the CIA as a member of the elite Senior Intelligence Service (SIS) with an equivalent rank of Major General.

Throughout his CIA career, Mr. Rustmann was heavily involved in the collection of foreign intelligence from human and technical assets, and the preparation and dissemination of raw intelligence reports and field assessments. Primary areas of reporting include the political and economic plans and intentions of foreign governments and political parties, counterintelligence, and counter-terrorism.

While living and working abroad he acquired a great deal of intimate knowledge of the history, politics, language and culture of the countries of his assignments and their neighbors.

As his career progressed, Mr. Rustmann's responsibilities and influence within the organization increased accordingly. He became heavily involved in liaison activities with senior foreign intelligence and police officials of friendly host governments, as well as with our own government and military, and with the devising and implementation of broad-ranging plans and programs in a number of countries important to the U.S. His management responsibilities included handling multi-million dollar projects, including responsibility in budget and personnel/staffing aspects, and direct supervision of large units of operations officers and clerical personnel in Washington and abroad. In one particularly rewarding assignment, Mr. Rustmann was selected to be an instructor of new Career Trainees at the CIA's covert training facility, "The Farm." This provided him with valuable experience in classroom teaching and public speaking, while the review served to hone his own basic case officer skills.

Throughout his career with the CIA, Mr. Rustmann was cleared for access to highly classified and sensitive policy and intelligence information. His dealings with senior U.S. military and civilian officials, as well as top foreign leaders, have endowed him with a great number of importance contacts and friends all over the world.
